




The Quilt Wyoming 2020 brochure has been mailed. Classes are planned. The committee is ready to welcome you!

**In the Beginning:** My first memories of sewing were being instructed by my mother. She had a Singer, circa 1937. My first projects were hemming flour sacks to be used for dish towels. Later, in Girl Scouts I learned clothing construction. I made quite a lot of my clothes when I was in high school and college.

My first quilt was in 1976, the year of the bicentennial. All things antique became very popular

that year. I made a quilt for my son's twin bed. At that time it was not easy to buy quilting fabric or any 100% cotton. Cotton/poly blends were big. I did find some, and along with fabric cut from a sheet, I made a nine patch with sashing. I didn't know anything about finishing a quilt, so

I'd like to thank the 76 members who signed up to be included in our mentor listing. It's great that you all are willing to help out and share your quilting knowledge. I even used the list in March to contact Carol Kolf for some information/how-to advise for thread painting. I've seen Carol's beautiful work and knew she'd be the one to ask. Even after watching some YouTube videos I still had several questions and she was able to help. I've got a lot of practicing ahead before I show anyone my attempts but Carol gave me the knowledge to at least give it a try. If you need some help with a technique give one of the mentors a call. You can find the list in the members only section on www.wsqg.org. If you would like to be included on the list let Virginia know or click the link on the members only page. Also, if you are a mentor you can use that same link to add a "specialty quilting technique" to your listing information, that way if someone has a specific technique they're having problems with they know who to call.

Included in this issue of Patchwords is a survey about social media. Please take the time to answer either by mailing the survey to me or by responding to the link Virginia will be sending everyone in an email. I would like to see WSQG on Instagram and Twitter as a way to increase our ability to reach a broader community; to share what WSQG is all about; provide a way to make announcements about activities quickly; share what we're working on, and to hopefully gain new members - maybe even some younger ones.

In February I went to QuiltCon (quilt show put on by the Modern Quilt Guild) in Austin, Texas. Not only did I see a lot of fantastic quilts but there were lots of younger (20-40 year olds) quilters in attendance. My age group (60's) was in the minority. So I know the younger quilters are out there we just need to figure out how to reach them. I think we as an

organization need to encourage new and younger quilters or we will become extinct as an organization. Your input into the social media discussion is needed so the board knows in what direction you would like us to move. Please take a few minutes to complete the survey. It's important that we hear from you about this issue.

I'm almost done with my WSQG Mystery Quilt, just have the final border to add. With luck I'll have it quilted and bound by QW20. 'Still planning to have a get-together at QW20. I am looking at after the Teacher Meet and Greet on Thursday evening. If you won't be attending, send me a picture of your quilt so I can share it with everyone. It's so interesting to see how different quilts made with the same pattern can be based on the fabric chosen. A big thank you to Barbara Graham for providing the clues for the mystery quilt. In case you didn't know, Barbara is not only an accomplished quilter but also a published author. The clues came from her book Murder By Kindness: The Gift Quilt (A Quilted Mystery). I want Barbara to see all the quilts we created. THANKS Barbara! Thirty-one signed up for the mystery, not bad for the first year. If you would like to see the mystery quilt program continue, send me an email.

Well, I need to end this and get those borders on.

#### Social Media Survey

According to Merriam-Webster's Dictionary social media is defined as "forms of electronic communication (such as websites for social networking and microblogging) through which users create online communities to share information, ideas, personal messages, and the content."

The board is considering creating a Social Media position (nonvoting) that would be responsible for maintaining WSQG information on relevant social media sites. One of the concerns brought up in the survey last year was how do we attract younger/new quilters. One way is to communicate through social media that younger people are using. A study from the Pew Research Center, a non-affiliated organization that records data and demographics, found that Instagram is used by 72% of people aged 13-17, 64% aged 18-29, and 40% aged 30-49 compared to 21% aged 50-60 and 10% aged 65-plus. and that few in the younger age groups use Facebook.

When I see other people's quilts my brain goes into overdrive thinking what I might make myself. I usually have several projects going at one time. Some projects are in the thought process and others are in the making. What I call my "show quilts" might take me two years to put together. I love the mental therapy quilting gives me. I also love seeing the finished product after weeks, months or years of work.

I made my first quilt in October of 2009. It took a while but I got it figured out. I read the pattern completely twice and it never did tell me what the seam allowance was. I used to sew a lot of clothes but I could tell the seam was NOT 5/8".

**Awards:** I have received numerous People's Choice awards and many First Place awards in Wyoming. I finally received an Honorable Mention in the Salt Lake show in 2019. I sent the same quilt to the Pacific International Quilt show in Santa Clara, California. That quilt won a Judges' Choice ribbon. I consider this an honor since there were 600 quilts and six judges. One judge wrote some awesome comments about the quilt. This year I was accepted into the Road to California show in January. This was their 25th Anniversary show. Both the quilts were accepted. To my complete surprise, both quilts received 2nd Place awards. I was awarded \$1500.00 in prize money for the two! Maybe I am breaking even on entry fees and cost for shipping both ways.

Quilting Influence: In the beginning
Stephanie Logan helped me out a lot. I
didn't know how to chain stitch or strip
piece. I was backstitching and cutting every
piece I sewed. Stephanie got me on the right
track. There are several ladies in our local
guild that have helped me a lot. I have taken
classes that inspired me. Leni Wiener is one
of them. She is a great teacher and talented
quilter. I am amazed at how helpful
everyone has been. I think I can now be of
help to others.

Favorite Tools: My favorite ruler is the 8-1/2" x 24-1/2". I can get four 2"-strips without disturbing my fabric. I use 2" for my bindings. I do like the tools to make better flying geese or half-square triangles. I use the Easy Angle and the Companion Angle. Just recently I used Bonnie Hunter's Essential Triangle tool. The half-square triangles came out well. I didn't have to trim them. I really like using the Gray Scale Card. It helps a lot with fabric selection.

Favorite Books: I bought a felted applique book a couple of years ago. It is all owls. There are 20 different owls and I made them all. I was able to make a four-owl wall hanging for each of the kids. I like Judy Niemeyer patterns. When you organize her instructions, the piecing process is made easier. I love Helen Stubbings patterns. She mixes English paper piecing (EPP), embroidery and applique in a lot of her patterns. I have many EPP patterns yet to make. I do have WAY too many patterns and books. I have a good selection from which to choose when looking for a new project.

Quilting Advice: Whatever you want to achieve is possible. Keep striving to get better. Relax and don't try to hurry through a project. Set some goals for yourself. Don't pay heed to what others are saying. You are an individual and should live your life as an individual. It's okay to ask for help and there are many people out there who are willing to help.

WSQG: I joined WSQG in 2010, I believe. I first went to a quilt show in the Northwest Region in Powell. I had made the challenge but didn't get a ribbon. I thought it was the best. We should feel that way about our work.

I love the camaraderie WSQG provides. I tend to keep to myself most of the time. I love when we come together once a year. I probably talk too much but then I'm isolated most of the time. I also like to take new classes and learn new techniques. I have applied many of the things I've learned at WSQG to some of my award-winning quilts.

I have a lot of silk fabric that I've wanted to use to make lightweight jackets. A class with clothing would be nice at Quilt Wyoming. I also love to learn new techniques so I look for that when I select classes at Quilt Wyoming. I took a class in Paducah to learn how to make a quilt from a photo. I have made a few but would like to do a lot more. Last year I took a class. The teacher machine sewed all of her EPP together. I took the class but said I would never do that. I am working on a quilt now that has so many pieces to it that I am machine sewing it together. "Never say never", as Fievel Mousekewitz would say!




there was no binding. I turned the outside edge and hand stitched. There was no quilting. I tied it. That was worse than any kind of quilting. What did I know? I have never tied a quilt since then! I didn't do any more quilting for many years.

When I moved to Sheridan in 1993 I joined the Creative Fiber Guild, and the quilting journey began! I took classes, and as most quilters do, I started by making traditional quilts. They were made for beds or as throws. In 2006 Ami Simms started a charity called Alzheimer's Art Quilt Initiative. Her goal was to raise \$1,000,000 for Alzheimer's research. I liked the idea, so I began making small quilted pieces for the online auction. The criteria was that the piece must fit in a priority-size envelope. Most of them were 9"x12". I was able to test a variety of techniques in that small format. During the next seven years I donated approximately 50 of these and raised over \$5,000 for AAQI from the sales.

Awards: One of the first art quilts that I made was for the WSQG challenge. It was called "Shaken, Not Stirred." I won first place in the challenge. That was a thrill! I have since won several more awards from the WSQG challenges. I won a "Best Use of Sulky Thread" award in the Hoffman Challenge. That was great fun. The prize was \$1,000 of their products. I have a lot of Sulky thread now! My biggest thrill was "1st Place Art Quilt" at the Rocky Mountain Quilt Festival in Loveland, Colorado.

In the Future: In the past few years I have been trying to expand my audience into the Fine Art genre. I have had quilted pieces on display for sale at several galleries. At one competition I won "Viewers' Choice". That was particularly thrilling because my competition was paintings. Recently, I was approached by an Art 321 board member in Casper about teaching and showing there. I have a class scheduled and I will be having a solo show in October when they have their fiber art show. I have something huge to plan.

Quilters in the Southwest Region devoted a significant amount of time during the beginning of the new year to charitable projects. One of the most meaningful programs has been making quilts for Blankets for

Kids with LOVE. When the completed quilts were collected at the beginning of March we were amazed that 140 quilts were donated, all of which will be allocated among six local social services agencies. These quilters have set the bar high for future quilt donations!

Meanwhile, Pam Wiggen continues to teach BOCES classes to beginning quilters. She recently finished teaching a class in which each participant donated at least one finished quilt to Blankets for Kids with LOVE. In total, the class members donated 23 quilts. In addition, two class members made 23 walker bags which were donated to a local senior center and three fidget blankets were also completed and donated. What a nice effort that benefited both the quilter and the recipient.

The Sweetwater County Quilt Guild began the new year by displaying members' quilts at the Sweetwater County Museum. Terri Thomas displayed a quilt entitled Flying Free, using a nine-patch technique she learned at last year's Quilting on the Green. Terri decided to challenge herself and do a miniature quilt which is shown here. The amazing thing about her quilt is that the individual squares in each nine-patch block finish at 1/2 inch.

Another impressive quilt was made by Nancy McConnell. She named it Stars + Stripes and she made it from scraps she found in a bag of red, white and blue scrap pieces from another quilt

she made years ago.
These are just two of the quilts included in the exhibit. Museum staff tell us that this annual quilt exhibit is becoming increasingly popular with local residents. The Sweetwater County Quilt Guild is now deciding on a theme for next year's exhibit.

Speaking of the Sweetwater County Museum, Amanda Benson, a curator at the museum, presented a

very informative program to the Sweetwater County Quilt Guild on the topic of quilt preservation at its February meeting. Robin Avery presented a program on color theory at the January meeting. Both speakers provided very helpful handouts for our future reference.

This is an exciting time for quilters in this region because Quilting on the Green is scheduled for May 29-30. The QOTG Committee continues to work hard to present a great event and I know from personal experience that it just gets better and better every year. It is a regional event that is an excellent opportunity not only for quilters in Sweetwater County but also for other Wyoming quilters. In addition to a quilt show, vendor mall and evening program, there will be four instructors.

PPQG members continue to make Honor Quilts for the Veterans in the Big Horn Basin. They are presented monthly to local veterans by Families on the Front Lines.


