

FEATURED QUILTER LYNDA LEEPER - Interview by Virginia Ohr

Linda Leeper (formerly Lynda Houfek) has been a WSQG member and supporter since 1998. She has worked to help other quilters and to support Multiple Sclerosis research. She served as WSQG president in 2005. Thank you for agreeing to be a featured WSQG Ouilter.

How did you become a quilter?

My grandmother was a quilter. She had a frame set up in her house. She took orders from people and sold her quilts. As a small child I would play on the floor under the frame when she was quilting. The light would radiate thru the fabric and the stitches would make designs on the floor. She would let me sort her button box! I think I was 11 or 12 when I actually could help her with the quilting on her sale quilts. Before that I would cut out pieces using newspaper pattern pieces and scissors. This was before rotary cutters and rulers.

What do you like most and when did you make your first quilt?

I enjoy the whole process of quilting starting with picking a pattern or drafting a design. Then picking the fabrics. There are so many colors and designs and amazing choices that the selection process is entertainment in its own way. I love the variety that is available. Then comes the construction phase when you start to build from an idea to completion. Then there is the finished product! I was probably nine when I made my first quilt with a lot of help from my grandmother. At about age 13 I did one by myself.

What awards have you received?

I entered a challenge from the Alaska Dyeworks Shop in Anchorage, Alaska. To enter the competition you had to use their hand dyes in your project. My pine tree was one of three entries selected to hang in their store for six months.

Who inspired you?

My grandmother, Iletta Price, would have been my first inspiration. I have been lucky enough to take classes from some amazing quilters. I really love taking classes. I think if you want to, you can learn something from every class you take. I have gone on several quilt cruises. They combine cruising, quilting and meeting new people. Quilt Seminars at Sea is my favorite. Check them out.

Tell us about your Fundraising Project to Fight Against Multiple Sclerosis.

Years ago I had a fundraiser in Big Piney. It was a quilt show and silent auction. Over a five year period, the show raised over \$38,000.00 for the Fight Against Multiple Sclerosis which is the disease I have. I had read some books by Earlene Fowler. She writes a series of mysteries that involve quilters. I contacted her about my fundraiser and she graciously sent autographed copies of her books before they were released. I would make a quilt of the pattern highlighted in the title of the

What do you like most about WSQG?

When did you join WSQG?

In 1996 or 1997 Wilda Vance sent out a survey asking about interest in a state quit guild. I was very excited about this possibility and I immediately returned the questionnaire. The very first Quilt Wyoming was held in 1998 in Casper and of course I attended.

What other quilt groups do you belong?

In addition to Quit Wyoming I belong to several guilds. They are Snake River Quilters, Idaho Falls; Jackson Hole Quilt Guild; Big Piney Sisters in Stitches; and Pinedale Sew Whats. Before Covid the Pinedale group would sew one Saturday a month in the shop at my house (pictured right).

FEATURED QUILTER BARB GORGES - Interview by Virginia Ohr

I joined the Wyoming State Quilt Guild in 1997, the first year it existed. I attended the first Quilt Wyoming in Casper where I taught two quilt classes based on my patterns/ techniques. They were published by Quilter's Newsletter Magazine in 1997 and 1999. It was fun teaching women who mostly had more quilt making experience than my students at Laramie County Community College where I concentrated on teaching beginning quilting and later, Electric Quilt, from 1995 to 2009.

My first attempt at quilt making was early 1979 in Stevens Point, Wisconsin, after I graduated from that UW in natural resource management. It was cold that winter while I waited for seasonal jobs to start, as a naturalist in New York City in the spring, then the Forest Service in the Black Hills for the summer and fall. I made a tied denim quilt using a book I found at the dime store, "Patchwork Quilts," by Barbara G. Jackson.

The next summer, working for the Bureau of Land Management in Rock Springs and living in a travel trailer parked out in the desert, I made a tied corduroy-top/bedsheet-back quilt with 100 percent cotton batting, all supplies purchased at the local Ben Franklin store. A couple years later, the now ex-boyfriend that I made it for, explained when he washed it, it became a soggy mass.

My first quilt show, as both exhibitor and visitor, was in 1980 in Laramie. I was studying range management at UW. By then I had three quilts to show: the denim quilt, a quilt I attempted to machine quilt on my mom's old Singer Featherweight, and an old wool comforter for which I made a patchwork cover. The Laramie quilters were very kind and encouraging.

In 1982 marriage took me to Miles City, Montana. I started meeting regularly with other quilters and learned how to hand quilt and use a rotary cutter. We started a quilt guild, made raffle quilts to raise funds for civic improvements, held a quilt show at the art center and I volunteered to organize a beginning quilting class at the community college. Eventually, a quilt shop opened locally so we could get cotton fabrics without driving 150 miles to Billings.

Moving to Cheyenne in 1989 was a big step in my quilting career. I won best of show at the county fair the first summer and the owner of the local quilt shop immediately called me and asked me to teach.

The Front Range is an exciting place to be a quilter—all those quilt shops between Cheyenne and Denver, the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum, the Quilter's Newsletter home office (now defunct), Colorado Quilt Council's events and others. Harriet Hargrave inspired me to invent the Gorges Quilt Care Label which I sold to quilters in every state and a few English-speaking countries over 17 years. You can find my distillation

of expertise on Amazon in my book, "Quilt Care, Construction and Use Advice."

I've enjoyed my membership in the Cheyenne Heritage Quilters for 31 years now. They let me chair the quilt show twice. We have interesting programs plus opportunities to volunteer and get to know each other better.

I come from a long line of engineers. I love the symmetry of traditional patchwork but always look for ways to tweak it, give it an original twist.

A couple of my "tweaks" have been juried into the American Quilters Society shows. One quilt won a ribbon at the National Quilting Association show. Another quilt was Wyoming's entry in a *Good Housekeeping* contest. Another quilt prompted an invitation from the Original Sewing and Quilt Expo folks to have three of my quilts included on an eight-city tour back east.

My priorities have changed over the last five or ten years. I want to be more physically active than the serious pursuit of quilting allows. I have vowed to make only bed quilts, including baby quilts, and to make at least one a year. So far, each year we've had at least one family wedding, baby, graduation or anniversary. I've entered all 317 completed quilts (including potholders) in a hardcover notebook. Since 1990 I've prepared a scrapbook page for each quilt with photo and fabric samples.

I'm no longer trying to compete with the absolutely astounding winners of the national competitions—I can't begin to get that good at machine quilting making only one quilt a year. Instead, I'm enjoying my partnership with professional machine quilter Virginia Ohr.

I've had a hand quilting project in progress for ten years at least. My husband and I are busy with Audubon and Master Gardeners and visiting family spread around the country.

As a charter WSQG member, I look forward to attending Quilt Wyoming when I can, to see old friends from around the state, meet new people and see what's new in quilting. As much as there is on the internet (I particularly enjoy Barbara Brackman's blogs), quilters already spend enough time alone quilting and we need to get together in person.



Over the past couple of months quilters in the Southwest Region have enjoyed some events despite Covid-19 restrictions.

In early September I visited Heritage Quilts & Fabric Shoppe in Pinedale during the Blooms on the Trail shop hop which includes quilt shops from Idaho, Utah and Wyoming. This was the 16th year for the event which included thirteen shops over a 601 mile loop. Heritage Quilts has participated in the shop hop for all sixteen years and offered a 16% discount in the entire shop to commemorate that milestone. Those quilters who visited all sixteen shops were eligible to win a Skyline S7 Janome machine and a Go! Big Electric Cutter Starter Set.

It was such fun to visit the shop and visit with Heather and her staff. Their impression was that quilters were anxious to return to some semblance of normalcy and they had had a record turnout of almost 500 participants during the two-week event. Each participant received a pattern for a paper pieced rose block and a pattern and fat quarter for the shop's rose appliqué block. Pictured below are the shop hop quilts created by Heritage Quilts in two different colorways.





The Sweetwater County Quilt Guild in Green River has resumed its monthly meetings with masks and social distancing. No refreshments because of the virus! Guild members are completing their crazy quilt projects for the annual guild exhibit at the Sweetwater County Museum in Green River.

In addition to the regular guild meeting, guild members were treated to a make-and-take holiday project. With the help of Barb Walker and Linda Travis they made holiday gnomes to kick off the holiday season.



Quilting on the Green which is normally held at the end of May was finally held on October 23 and 24 at Expedition Island Pavilion in Green River. It is a beautiful quilt and very fitting since the event is held at a site on the Green River.



That's all I have for now. I think quilters are working on holiday gift quilts and other quilt projects and hunkering down for what may be a long winter, given the recent surge in Covid-19 cases. I often think how lucky we are to be quilters which is an activity we can enjoy while being restricted because of the virus. Hopefully we are all putting this time to good use to finish old projects and start new ones.

been quilting like mad. I wanted to share a couple of things that have been happening here in the Southeast Region.


We just had our Fall Retreat and it was a big success. Everyone



Sadly the CFG Christmas Celebration and silent auction in Sheridan has been cancelled for 2020. Threaders gift exchange will still take place on December 15th.




