## *Sew Together Bag by Sew Demented*

The perfect size bag for so many uses. It is 10 inches long and 14 inches around, with 3 zippered pockets and 4 open pockets inside. Wow! Use it to organize sewing supplies at home or at a retreat or class. Use it as a cosmetics bag. Use it to organize office supplies or that junk drawer we all have. Embellish the outside with embroidery, with applique, with some easy quilt piecing, or leave it plain. Give as Christmas gifts, with or without items already included. This beginner level bag can be completed in a 1 day class and you will learn to easily install zippers several different ways and to apply binding to the exterior edges.

### **Class Supplies:**

- ✓ Sew Together Bag pattern, available at many quilt stores and online.
- ✓ Rotary cutting mat, a rotary cutter and some rulers.
- ✓ Sewing machine and general sewing supplies (manual for your machine, bobbins, scissors, pins, seam ripper, etc.)
- ✓ Bring an assortment of feet for your machine, **including the ¼" foot and the zipper foot.**
- ✓ Several sizes of needles for your machine (universal, sharp, or topstitching).
- ✓ Cotton or polyester thread is acceptable, although I prefer polyester for sewing bags.
- ✓ **Fabric:** The exterior requires a 10" by 14" piece of fabric, the rest of the bag will take around 1 yard of fabric. You can follow the pattern guidelines or use any combination of fat quarters and cut yardage to make 1 yard. Be as subtle or wild as you like!
- ✓ Around 1 yard of medium weight fusible interfacing, I prefer HTC Form Flex or Pellon SF 101 Shape Flex woven fusibles
- ✓ One 10" by 14" piece of batting, fusible fleece, or Soft and Stable.
- ✓ One 18" or longer purse zipper – which coordinates with outside fabric or binding.
- ✓ Three 9" or longer zippers – which coordinate with the inside of the bag.

There is no kit fee. No precutting is expected before class.
