

# Featured Ouilter - Janet Hoxie



Hoxie. Sheridan, agreed to be our featured quilter. I have long talents as a

Janet

teacher and quilter and her entrepeneur spirit. Janet has designed and marketed several notions that offer better ways to do things in quilting (Bobbin Buddies, Quilter's Quarter Marker, Roll-a-Tote, Applique Advantage and many more). Her company is called Sew Unique (www.sewunique.com). Like her quilter's aids, her quilts are "unique". Thank you, Janet for sharing your story with us.

*Motivation* ~ I've always been fascinated by guilts, but after watching a documentary on PBS about the Shelburne Museum's quilt collection, I was hooked. When arranging a trip to Vermont a few years later, I made a point of visiting the museum to see the quilts in person.

Most enjoyed ~ Expressing my creativity through pattern and color. To me, quilting fabrics have so much more depth than other art media, seeing them and using them just enriches my soul.

*In the beginning* ~ I started my first quilt over 30 years ago, but sadly, I must admit that I am much better at starting quilts and other projects than I am at finishing them. The excitement of planning a new project is what enthralls me, but often projects languish if I don't have a specific event or deadline for them, or when I get the next idea.

Awards ~ I have won a few county fair ribbons here and there. While I have utmost respect and admiration for quilt show participants and winners, I'm not one for entering quilts in shows. I've been known to get really frustrated

they didn't understand my motivation or process.

Inspiration ~ Any artist who bends traditional styles into something fresh. I remember attending a lecture by Jinny Beyer about her "soft-edge piecing" admired her technique, and then waiting impatiently for the book to come out. Inspiration has also come from Joan Wolfrom with her books and workshops on color and her work on landscapes. I am frequently inspired by other art forms, such as tile work and rugmaking.

> Favorite tools ~ Hands down, my favorite tools are rotary cutters and acrylic rulers. Those tools have made quilting so much more approachable and less tedious than older methods, not to mention faster and much more accurate.

*Quilt book favorites* ~ For the most part, I prefer block encyclopedias and block references as opposed to books with specific patterns in them. I'm also a huge fan of Dover books on decorative art forms as they are a great source of inspiration for design work.

Quilting advice ~ As I've learned from quilting as well as other needle arts, do the thing that you can't NOT do. If you can't stand the idea of making something really basic as a beginner project, then do the thing that will make your heart sing, even if it's way over your head. Challenge makes us stronger, and overcoming challenge brings more satisfaction than whipping up the easy project. There's so much to be learned if you push your personal envelope.

 $WSQG \sim$  I've been involved with WSQG since the first Quilt Wyoming, though I have not always been an active member. Where else can you find that many creative people, who speak your language, in one place? While there may be some friendly competition, we're really just a big group learning from and being inspired by each other. What could be better?

when a judge's comments indicated that Suggestions to improve WSOG ~ I am not sure about suggesting improvements. The offerings are pretty varied, with something for everyone.

> Additional thoughts ~ My love for quilting has inspired me to invent quilting and sewing products, and being able to call myself an inventor is a huge thing for me. It was hard to say out loud at first, but once I realized I didn't have to be on the same level as Thomas Edison or Alexander Graham Bell to be one, it was easier to feel comfortable using the words.

My inventions are all products of my frustrations, and it was very liberating for me to realize that I could create products that not only solved my own problems but those of others as well.


I also love to teach others, and share my passion for quilting and other forms of needlework. Teaching is also a great way to become re-inspired by a style or technique, as students always bring a fresh perspective and sometimes great ideas pop into my head while conversing with students.

I enlarged a coloring book picture. I used foundation paper piece techniques to create this quilt.





I designed this as a take-off on a pattern from Janet Kime's book Log Cabins: New Techniques for Traditional Quilts.

The cats quilt was made for my mother, the pattern is 'Topsy Turvy Cats' by Mary Mandell, which I started in 1992, and is the reason I started my business. There were places where you had to sew a 1/2-square triangle to a square, and it required a lot of measuring and marking. The frustration of that process is what inspired me to invent the Quilter's Quarter Marker(tm).



The embroidery work is from my technique and class "Crazy Quilting with Wool."






