Committee to inform you that we have added another day to our conference next July 13-17!


Because the extension to three class days was so popular in Powell, we set out to do the same AND we are happy to announce that we have also added a third National Teacher!



Featured Quilter Angela McPherson



I am originally from a little town called Secretary, Maryland. I joined the Air Force when I was 19 and served for eight

years. My first duty station was Elmendorf, Alaska where I met my husband, Mac. We were transferred to Malmstrom, Montana where I had my two beautiful daughters, Alex and Autumn. We moved to Minot, North Dakota; Eielson, Alaska; Mountain Home, Idaho; and now F.E. Warren, Wyoming. My husband just retired this year in June after 24 years of service. As of now we plan to stay in Wyoming until the kids are out of school.

I am a WSQG member, member of High Plains Modern Art Quilters (HPMAQ), and the Cheyenne Heritage Quilters (CHQ). I am the Facebook Monitor for both HPMAQ and the CHQ and Newsletter Editor for CHQ for 2021. I also created a CHQ BOM 2021 quilt since I thought we needed to do more during this COVID time in our lives.

How did you become a quilter?

I swore I would never be a quilter. It wasn't my style. Those who know me can laugh now. Mac told me one day that I needed a hobby while he was going out into the field and deployed. I guess going to college, raising two toddlers, and a full-time job was not enough. But lucky me... he bought me a simple sewing machine. I started making the girls little dresses, pjs, doll dresses, purses, and odd-and-end gifts. Then I got an embroidery machine and started making more things... which led to personalized blankets that turned into blocks with applique. Before I knew it, I



made my first quilt. I liked the process but did not like the rules, so I started more with art quilts. I bought my first art quilting kit from Northern Threads in Alaska which was a bargello quilt with an appliquéd Moose and trees. I didn't' know what I was doing but I made my first quilt, Free Motion Quilting and all. Then I branched off into my own art quilts. I put my "Military Family" art quilt into the fair, with the encouragement of my husband, and won Grand Championship. Okay, he entered it as I was too nervous. Mac went into the building first and came out excitedly with the news that I won! I could not believe it. I did get one comment, learn how to bind without bulk. After much research and trial and error, I accidentally became a quilter.



What do you most enjoy about quilting?

I truly love the friendships that comes with quilting. Who would have thought how friendly a group of strangers truly can be? It doesn't matter if a quilter knows the other quilter or not. Put quilters together and we talk non-stop as if we are long-lost friends. Honestly, the military life was hard because of the moves and starting over again. I had developed anxiety and was told that I needed to face my "False Fears". So, my husband took me to my first quilt guild meeting in Fairbanks, Alaska in February when it is normally -40 degrees F. He waited in the car while I tested out this new group. He was my "getaway driver" if I felt the need to bail. But the Cabin Fever Quilters accepted me with open arms. I joined their community quilters' group on Saturdays and learned that by helping others I had learned more about the basics of quilting. Trust me, I have so much more to learn. When you hang


out with a group of quilters, I learned quickly that you will get someone's opinion whether you asked or not. I also learned you get a lot of advice and opinions during retreats too. I love it!!!

I went to my first quilt retreat in Idaho with my mother-in-law. It was a beautiful location up on a mountain and was a large cabin and we stayed in little cabins nearby. Who knew retreats came with meals and all you had to do was talk, I mean sew with other wonderful ladies? I was incredibly nervous to go to my first retreat. I researched how to calm my nerves. I read a tip that suggested bringing something to share with everyone to use as an ice breaker. So, I bought Alaska-themed batik fat quarters. That got expensive fast. I made a few friends. It made my first retreat more relaxing and fun. I love going to retreats to see everyone's tastes and preferences in their quilting machines, notions, décor... You get to see so many projects. I learned to take projects that don't require too much thinking because you get distracted by all the wonderful conversations and seeing what others are working on. It is important to bring a few projects for show and tell. I once told my nonquilting mother I was going to play strip poker with my mother-in-law at a retreat. She was very disappointed in me. LOL! I had a lot of explaining to do!

Who has inspired you?

I will start off crediting my friends and family. My husband is my biggest supporter and often helps me when I get stuck or if I need a solution or a plastic thingy fixed because I was too tough on it. He has always created a space of my own, no matter where we lived. I have a group of friends in Mountain Home that welcomed me into their little quilting shop. Just a place to quilt with friends. Pat Mean (I called her nice) Donna, Candi, and Little Donna meant the world to me. They encouraged me in many ways, but I learned to become, dare I say, a teacher of sorts. That little nonofficial group of ladies were the most giving ladies I ever knew. When we moved to F.E. Warren AFB I looked around quickly for guilds. I joined both the WSQG and the CHQ in 2019. I learned that if you love something and want to make friends or be part of the

community, go find a group of people who love the same thing. I made friends fast here. Di Wilsey-Geer is always a wonderful sounding board for me and we seem to be each other's enablers and cheerleaders. Linda Herget always finds ways to get us girls quilting together. Linda Warby is a wonderful soul to visit with. Joy Mocklemann gives you her heart, sound advice and great food. My mother-in-law, Lori McPherson, who quilts everything in perfection and encourages me to do better. And my friend Robin Dempsey pushes me to be more creative with no boundaries and very little rules. These ladies are true friends who inspire me to become more. When one friend sees a project, we all jump in to do it together. They have encouraged me to teach (unofficially) which helps me practice getting in front of others and have more confidence in what I do and keep fear at bay. They taught me to choose whose critical comments to learn from and those I should let go. No one is perfect.

I do watch a lot of videos and read many books. I turn to Angela Walters for FMQ (free motion quilting) and having her own humble opinion. I admire Emily Taylor for her realistic collage quilts but more so for bouncing back after a few business failures and continues to do what she loves. Kimberly Einmo is inspiring for having the courage to never say no to a quilting job and getting the job done with a smile as her AF Retired husband supports her. I enjoy Jenny Doan for her quick easy and carefree quilting style. I admire Rob Appell for doing what he loves and was able to stay sober by pouring his focus into quilting and teaching instead of alcohol. I love Kathy McNeil's awesome, detailed art quilts. Susan Carson's crazy collage quilts are wonderful. I follow Rachelle Denneny for her easy-to-follow FMQ lessons online. Beret Nelson is another favorite, who owns "On the Trail Creations". It is funny I once went to Anchorage from Fairbanks, Alaska and found the cutest quilted post card and bought the kit only to find out that Beret was in Fairbanks with me. I bought many of her patterns and kits as I started my journey to art quilts as they are simple but very eye-catching designs. And last but not least, our local Cheyenne FMQ teacher Penny Olive,

who gives quilters confidence in quilting their quilts, has helped me. There are so many YouTube videos, Craftsy, iQuilt, Annie's Catalog courses that I turn to that I am thankful I live in a time where the fabric is pretty, and the teachers are in abundance. So yes, I have many people who inspire me, but it is my friends and family that mean the most to me.

Do you have favorite quilting tools? I am a notion lover. But my favorite tool is my stiletto. My husband got a lathe for Christmas one year and he made me a stiletto that fits perfectly in my hand. It's my third hand. Oh my gosh, what a game changer to be able to make sure your fabric goes under the needle without the fear of a hospital bill because you stitched your finger! I also like pipe cleaners to clean my machines. I clean them with every bobbin and needle change. I also love my wonder clips or the knock-off versions. They keep the bulk of the fabric in place. I love the tools I get outside the quilt store such as a magnetic bowl, pen telescope magnet, telescope mirror, little screw drivers that I got in an automotive store. My husband bought me a little screwdriver set that I use often. I've caught him in my sewing

room using my tools a little too often!

When I joined in 2019, the SE Region oversaw the state retreat. I had never had the opportunity to take classes from my inspirational quilters before. I didn't get to take them then either... we were just moving, and money was tight, so I just did the free sewing and was so envious of those who got to go to the classes. But I got to meet so many wonderful ladies. As I have only been here for a couple years it is apparent that our Di knows everyone, and she is so sweet to introduce me to our fellow quilters and has been my friend from the beginning. The SE Region has put on wonderful quilt retreats thanks to Linda Herget and Francis Tormey. I find that I'm biting at my nails to get to the September retreat this year. When you are a military family, it's hard making friends and being part of the community. WSQG is a wonderful way to make new friends quickly and everlasting.

What would you like to see offered in

the future by WSQG?

I think WSQG is doing a wonderful job. I think the only thing that would be nice is maybe some Zoom or Facebook get togethers to show what we are making... a virtual show and tell because of how spread out we are.

Sometimes if you are nervous, you just have to jump in, no matter what. We learn from our mistakes. We get better with practice. I'm so thankful to be part the WSQG and welcomed here in

Wyoming by all of you wonderful souls. I would like to thank you for giving me the opportunity to share my very long quilting story.












Paintbrush Piecers Quilt Guild members recently toured Jan Sapp's Alpaca farm and Heartworks, her Powell store. This was a great first-hand experience with the fleece, from the live animals to products such as socks, gloves, hats, scarves and even a quilt batt. Shearing produces up to ten pounds of fleece per animal, per year and is stronger, lighter, and warmer than wool. Unlike sheep's wool, alpaca fleece contains no lanolin and is therefore ready to spin after only nominal cleaning. It doesn't irritate sensitive skin like wool. The members got to feed the alpaca, see the bagged fleece, and see the fleece being processed on a felting machine.
