Sherry Fink was a WSQG founding member, teacher, and friend. She served on the board for a total of nine years. Sherry was the first Northwest Regional Director. She was WSQG President-Elect and President in 2001-2003. She also served as Director-at-Large. She helped with Quilt Wyoming in Powell many times. She was co-chair with Michelle Quick for Quilt Wyoming 2001 in Powell.

When she left the President's position she gave board members a gift, which was the custom. She gave us pin cushions. I use that brightly colored mouse pin cushion daily and I think of her each time.

She was a true source of guild history and information. As a board member I alway felt more secure when Sherry was

present. Sherry was quiet and wise. When she would laugh, it felt like a reward.

She was a key board member for the Black Hills Quilt Retreat for 20 years. She taught classes at Mallo Camp for 15 years. When attending that retreat, I always looked forward to seeing Sherry. I took a rag jacket class from her about 18 years ago.

When we took a road trip to Big Horn Quilts in Greybull, Julie Owens' wonderful quilt shop, we could see Sherry who was always there and working hard. She worked there for over 12 years. She taught classes at that shop and across the state.

I didn't see many finished quilts that Sherry made, though I am sure there were many. She once told me that she liked to learn how to make them, and learn the technique.

She started quilting when she lived in Casper, 43 years ago. Sherry was to be the featured quilter at the upcoming Yellowstone Quilt Fest in Cody. Her quilts will be on display for all to enjoy.

Ken, Sherry's husband, was always supportive and sometimes she referred to him as her 'secretary'. He was much more. I am sure that Sherry was equally supportive of Ken. How inspiring to see a couple that complemented the other as they did.

She was a dear friend to many and it is difficult to process this loss. She became ill with cardiac problems a couple years ago. More recently she suffered from other complications. It was nice to see her for a short visit during the 2021 annual meeting at Quilt Wyoming 2020-2021 in Powell.

Kathleen Bertoncelj shares Sherry's oftrepeated advice, "**If you don't have time to do it right the first time, when will you?**" Kathleen remembers a class taught by Jean Welch in Casper. Several drove from Laramie for her multi-session Seminole jacket class. Sherry's Seminole garment had been accepted at Paducah. That was the highlight of the class!

Vikki Chenette: I will always remember meeting Sherry in 1998, at my first Black Hills Quilting Retreat. She quietly made me feel at home as a new instructor there. A few years later, Sherry's calm, pragmatic, and insightful manner provided an important role model for me when I became a WSQG board member. She made difficult things appear effortless, avoided drama, and inspired cooperation. Her vision and legacy can be seen at every Quilt Wyoming gathering, Regional Quilt Event, and Kids' Quilt Day Camp the guild sponsors. I'm grateful to have had the opportunity to have worked with and have learned from her example.

Services were held on November 20, 2021, at the Grace Lutheran Church in Greybull, Wyoming.

Regional Happening Funding

WSQG has set aside funds for each region to assist with the funding of regional events. These events must meet certain criteria. Events may be retreats, classes, demonstrations, shows, or speaker presentations. \$600 per region has been budgeted. Funding will reduce the cost but is not intended to cover the cost of the event entirely. January 15 is the deadline to apply for funding.

Invitations must be made to the entire region. Others outside the region may be invited if space is available after regional members have had the opportunity to register. Funds may NOT be used for door prizes, food, gifts or sewing notions.

Funds may be used for teacher fees, facility costs, postage and supplies, and advertising to announce and confirm registration. Events must not realize a profit and funds may not be carried forward. If a profit is realized then funds must be returned to WSQG (501c non-profit). The requestor must provide a report with receipts to the Board of Directors.

The application goes to the regional director of the region where funds are requested. The regional director brings the request to the board on January 15 and funding is decided on a competitive basis.

If funds remain unallocated in one region after May 15 of that year, those funds may be allocated to another region who requests assistance.








The Hulett group is sewing away this fall with an Improv class, a scrappy squared class and the sixpart mystery class.

Stitches N Time Quilt Guild – Douglas




