#### Featured Quilter Maggie Winfield



My Creative Quilting journey started a long, long time ago, 74 years, to be exact. It was in a galaxy far, far away on a small farm outside of Memphis, Tennessee. I was the oldest of five girls. From the time I was a little girl, I loved working with fabric. 4-H was my organization of choice and taught me many valuable lessons. The biggest was perseverance. I had to learn how to deal with all the 3<sup>rd</sup> place (white) clothing ribbons I received. I made my first quilt at 19. An older neighbor taught me how to hand piece and my father set up her

quilting frame in the basement of my nursing school so I could do the quilting.

After I was married in 1970, I made some polyester baby quilts and tied quilts for my kids. We moved to Denver in 1981 and I took my first real quilting class around 1983. About 1988, my world exploded. I discovered pieced and quilted garments. WOW, quilts that I could wear. How wonderful was that. I took two great garment design classes. One from Barbara Barr from Colorado and the second was from Rachel Clark from California. My wearable art journey began and I have never looked back. Almost like The Wizard of Oz in black and white Kansas and then the brilliant color in Oz.

I have never minded being different, except in high school. I don't count that since no one wants to be different in HS. I was shocked the first time a quilting guild asked me to be a speaker. "Who, me???" I discovered that I loved talking about garments and encouraging other women to branch out and be more adventurous in their clothing. I wanted

them to have as much fun as I was having. Along the way, I have painted shoes. Those created quite a stir. I have made jewelry. Every woman needs great jewelry to go with wonderful.



creative clothing. Creating fun, clothing and accessories was the way to go and fed my creative spirit.

I was juried into the AQS fashion show in Paducah in the early 1990's. Other than that national show, I enjoyed entering local county fairs and the Colorado State Fair. I also was involved with some local quilt guilds and the Colorado State Quilt Guild. AND I made a few quilts.

In the mid 2000's, a quilt art friend and teacher encouraged me to try out for the Bernina Fashion Show at the Houston Ouilt Festival. I was reluctant. My first thought was that my work wasn't good enough. She gave me some great advice that I have often shared. She told me to



not tell people that I was entering a juried show and that if I didn't get

Hello All,


What a great time we had during the Holidays. Many friends and family members shared their joy with us!

selected no one had to know. If I was selected, I could tell everyone. That's what I did! To my amazement, I was selected to be a Bernina fashion show designer the last two years of the show in 2007 and 2008. To see my garments on the runway was priceless. My youngest daughter introduced me to the thrift store in the mid 90's and my creative clothing journey changed again. I love the challenge of upcycling and repurposing thrifted garments. Thrifting is good for my pocketbook and for the environment. I still make garments from scratch but mostly remake and decorate thrifted garments.



I joined WSQG in 2002 after my daughter moved to Sheridan. I have attended many Quilt Wyoming's and have taught at a couple of them. Wyoming welcomed me and I call it my second home.

A famous quilt teacher once told me that I was walking art. I have met so many people while wearing my garments and accessories. One comment I get is "Do you look like this all the time". My answer is "Yes"! Another comment is "I want to be like

you when I grow up". That one always makes me smile, especially when I hear it from teenagers and young adults. I have received comments from men and women, old and young and from people from all walks of life. I also enjoy hearing that I made someone smile or made their day. A friend once said that she felt invisible and ignored when she turned 50. I told her that I might get ignored but no one could pretend they didn't see me. My husband was with me at the Houston Quilt Festival the first year my garment was in the Bernina show. After I had been stopped numerous times for someone who wanted my picture and people taking my picture on the sly, he told me that this must be how if feels to be around paparazzo. For me it's certainly fun.

I am thankful that my husband and children have always been my biggest supporters. Once my youngest daughter came home from college and told me not to be insulted but that my brain was weird. It's special that my husband and kids can handle my flamboyant style and my weird brain.



This has been a holiday tradition for the guild for many years and the yarn donations are very much appreciated by both the students and staff at the Wyoming Girls School.

The Sweetwater County Quilt Guild had a very busy December meeting which included a potluck of Christmas goodies. Guild members exchanged sets of four mug rugs for its gift exchange and everyone was delighted with the mug rugs they received. As you can see from the picture below, members were very creative in preparing their gifts.





Barb Walker and Shelly Rowland presented a program on making Christmas Tree napkins. They provided the materials necessary for each member to complete one napkin. These napkins are reversible and are very striking on a holiday table.

The guild is gearing up for its annual museum exhibit at the Sweetwater County Historical Museum which will be displayed in March. This year guild members are submitting table runners for the exhibit.

On March 12th the **Quilting on the Green** Committee is holding a unique fundraiser which will teach participants how to make wooden barn quilt blocks. I am anxious to see the finished barn blocks and will share pictures when they are

complete. This is a fun and innovative fundraiser and it has generated a lot of interest.



I understand that quilting fabric is even sold in some hardware stores in this region. I will be reporting on what I discover and will share information on every quilt store in this region in my next report. I hope that will help quilters from this region and throughout the state locate these resources and support them.


I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season. Some of us here in the corner of the




