The ByLaws and Standing Rules are reviewed by the Board every other year. This was done in 2021. When a change is needed during the even year, those changes are presented at the general meeting at Quilt Wyoming for a vote.

Every effort should be made to fill offices according to the rules set forth by the ByLaws. When that search is exhausted without finding a volunteer, and the existing Regional Director is willing to continue serving, then it might be necessary for that Director to continue serving. Below is a proposed change we wish to present to general membership for a vote on July 17, 2022.

Section 5.2 TERM OF OFFICE: ... The Secretary, Treasurer, Regional Directors, Membership Director, and Director-at-Large may serve only two terms consecutively. In the event that the Regional Directors are unable to find a replacement to run for office, an additional two-year term may be served. ...



She also teaches new quilt machine owners in her home. The largest part of her business is custom quilting but she does edge-to-edge quilting as well.

Featured Quilter Val Wimbish



I've recently had a wonderful trip down memory lane preparing this short story of my quilting journey.

My sweet grandmother,

I called her MawMaw, started me off hand sewing scraps of cotton fabric into doll quilts to be tied with scrap yarn from her knitting basket. The fabric from the back, probably an old shirt or bedsheet, was folded over the front to be sloppily stitched down by my five-yearold self.

After Home Economics in 7th and 8th grades, I would sew squares together with my mom's Singer and make quilts for family pets, again tying them with yarn. I grew up making clothes for myself and altering and enhancing clothes for friends and family, continuing into married life and having children. Funny thing, I never made a quilt for my children when they were young!

I have always loved fabric and color. I have always admired quilts from long ago that survived time and use, to be displayed in museums or passed down through generations. I inherited an 1885 crazy quilt made by a great, great, great grandmother commemorating the birth of my great grandmother, Valley Virginia VanSandt. It is a beautiful piece of art with velvets, silks, old campaign ribbons and stunning embroidery, both on the full-size quilt and a bolster cover. It is extra special because I'm named after Valley and had her in my life till I was sixteen years old. Her daughter was my MawMaw who lived to be 101 years old and a huge influence in my life.

My sister-in-law, Karen Ewart, is the person who introduced me to "real" quilting and I've been addicted since! She started inviting me to the Casper Cutup meetings in the early 1990's when on home leave from living in Indonesia. I have such a collection of traditional batik, many hand made by little old ladies with wax pens, free handing designs. My first handmade, handpieced and hand-quilted, small quilt was made with these special batiks. They

lend themselves to hand quilting because you can outline the design. Since 1996 on our return from Jakarta, I have taken many classes, attended Friday night sew ins at my local quilt shop, watched demonstrations on technique both in person and on line. The ladies in the Cutups were an invaluable source of anything quilting and in 2000 I became a member. Karen and I have had many a memorable "quilt in" as we share 30plus family members and always have an "occasion" that requires a quilt to be made and lovingly given away. I know our love of quilting has made us best friends and "real" sisters.

I am a piecer first and foremost. I can quilt and will do small projects if I'm in a hurry but find it so freeing to have Virginia Ohr work her magic on my quilts. We have become friends over the years with our love of quilting and travel. She and I think so much alike when it comes to choosing a pattern for a particular quilt, the size of the pattern and the thread color. It's always so much fun to see our "vision" come to life!

I have quilts in almost every room of both homes, Casper and Katy, Texas, and they make me feel so happy as they all have such sweet memories associated with them. I'm so fortunate to have attended and or worked as a Quilt Angel, at over 20 International Quilt Festivals in Houston. I've lived and traveled many places around the world and always come home with at least one pattern and local fabric as my souvenir. I did live in Libya for almost four years so have dozens of African fabrics in sixmeter lengths that make great borders and backs and fit well in the African room I have in my house for my grandsons.

I have made two quilts for my DAR chapter to raffle off raising money for Veterans organizations which is another important part of my life.

Well, that's my story (maybe not so short). Thanks for letting me share my journey.

I have been around sewing and fabric most of my life. My mother was a fabulous seamstress, tailor and crafter. She managed Marilyn's Fabrics in Casper for years and my first job at 14 was working Saturdays at the fabric store. She made a few quilts but her passion was garment making.

I was introduced to quilting by my good friend Irene Eeles. She was a charter member of the Casper Cut Ups when the group formed in the early 90's. After a year of asking me to join, I finally said yes and needless to say I was hooked. It is great fun to be in a group of talented women who are always willing to learn new techniques and share their knowledge. In the early years, several of us joined Quilt Nebraska and attended their annual meetings. The group was so excited when WSQG was formed and we all joined. I am proud to say I have been a member ever since. I love the newsletter as it is so important to celebrate Wyoming quilters, shop owners and introduce young people to quilting.

In the early 2000's, a group of women from Laramie started documenting antique quilts in Wyoming. I participated in the training and helped at several sites around the state. There are some beautiful old quilts that reside in Wyoming and I am very lucky to have one quilt that was made by my grandmothers aunt.

I have to admit that my favorite part of the quilt process is piecing and I will quilt small projects but anything large goes to those amazingly talented longarm quilters. My sister-in-law, Val Wimbish, introduced me to batiks, as she lived in Indonesia and brought back some beautiful fabrics. I love the feel of the cotton, the bright colors and there is minimal

traveling! They are my "go to" fabric because they pair well with all quilting fabrics.

I am Looking forward to Quilt Wyoming in Sheridan for the 25th Anniversary of the Wyoming State Quilt Guild.





It is hard to believe that this is my last report as director for the

Southwest Region. The last four years have flown by and I have enjoyed sharing news about quilters and quilting activities in this region. I have made new friends and learned a lot about the quilting community in Southwest Wyoming.

In March the **Quilting on the Green** Committee held a very successful fundraiser for its June event. Twenty-four quilters met at the Island Pavilion in Green River for the Barn Quilt class. The class was so well received that it will be held

again in October

Using tape and paint, participants were able to create historic quilt patterns on prepared wood bases. Not only did each participant leave with a completed project, but they learned a lot about the history of barn quilts and traditional quilt patterns. The QOTG Committee put a lot of work into this project and I think it was the most popular and successful fundraiser I've ever seen.





One of my last goals as Regional Director was to visit all of the quilt stores in my region and share information about them so that members of the WSQG would know about quilting resources in this region. So in April I headed out with three of my best quilting friends (Kayleen, Gay and Holly) and we spent a day on a shop hop of our own making. We started our Southwest Wyoming shop hop in Kemmerer where we visited the quilt store located in the **Ace Hardware** store in historic downtown Kemmerer. quilt store that has been serving the quilting community in this region since 1984.



We then headed to Evanston where we spent time at A **Common Threads** in Evanston. This is a great shop that has been in

business for eighteen years. It is owned by two friends whose daughters also work in the shop. Three long arm quilt machines allow the staff to



provide quilting services for their area.

In addition to a great variety of fabric and quilting supplies,



the store also offers quilters a choice of three ongoing block of the month programs.

cooked favorites such as pot roast and chicken fried steak, and desserts to die for such as pies and pineapple upside down cake. Breakfast is served all day long.

Then we were off to the **Valley Fabric Shop** in Erie, Wyoming. This store opened in 1979 and was featured in the Spring/Summer 2017 issue of *Quilt Sampler Magazine*. For more than 40 years it has been a mainstay for quilters in Southwest Wyoming. The shop has a wide range of western-themed fabric. It also displays over 200 vintage toy sewing machines.

Charla and Bobbi are particularly proud of having taught at least 500 children to quilt and having guided Make a Child Smile which has delivered more than 1000 quilts to Primary Children's Hospital in Salt Lake City, Utah. The shop designs four Saturday Sampler quilts a year and is the only source of bucking horse milky which is shown in the background of the picture below.




This shop is a must-see for quilters traveling along I-80 in southwest Wyoming. It is located only 3.5 miles south of I-80 between Evanston and Green River.

There are three other shops in this region which I intend to visit in the next few weeks — A Little Country Character in

Green River, **Beyond Bolts** in Thayne and **Heritage Quilts** in Pinedale. I'll make sure information about those shops is included in the next report from this region.

Quilting on the Green will again be held at Expedition Island in Green River on June 3rd and 4th. This event just gets better each year. Debby Walters is a national instructor from Texas and she will be teaching The Swirl using Louisa Smith's apostrophe template. Other instructors include Marla Marx, Deonn Stott and Luanne Roberts. There is definitely a class for everyone in this year's lineup.

Robin Avery presented a great program to the **Sweetwater County Quilt Guild** during its April meeting. She taught us how to make Cathedral Windows and provided everyone with a kit and detailed instructions for the technique. One of the best things about quilters is their willingness to share their knowledge with fellow quilters.



I'm very excited about Quilt Wyoming and can't wait to see everyone in Sheridan. Just a few days later, July 21-23, the Salt Lake City 2022 Quilt Festival will be held at the Salt Palace. This is a great opportunity for quilters in Wyoming to experience an International Quilt Festival event.




