Northeast: The 40th NEW Quilt Show in Gillette, October 1-2, promises to be an event to remember. October 1-29 will feature the Fiber Arts Show at the Fullmer Library in Sheridan.

Northwest: The Quick Retreat will be held in Cody October 25-30. The first Hot Spot Quilt Retreat will be held in Thermopolis on September 30-October 2. Friends and Company will be having a retreat at Holiday Inn in Cody October 19-23. Textile Artists of Greater Yellowstone members will display monthly art quilt challenges in the Cody branch of the Park County Library for the entire month of October.

Southeast: The fall retreat was held in September 23-25. Southeast members are busy planning Quilt Wyoming 2024.

Planning for Quilt Wyoming begins four years out.

Volunteers are needed to help with the many tasks. It is a lot of work but a lot of fun too! Contact your regional director to find out when the next meeting is in your region.

Enjoy the quilting events and the fall season. Local quilt shops offer many opportunities for classes and retreats. It is important to support the local shops so that they can continue offering these opportunities.

It's not too early to plan those holiday projects! I hope to see you at some of these events.



Featured Quilter & Shop Owner Nichole Huddleston



My quilting story starts out with a sad beginning....My mom passed away in April 2000. As the years passed, I had this vision of making a quilt out of my mom's old western polyester suits. I found out that a friend of mine did some sewing and quilting so I asked her if she would be willing to help me cut up the clothes of my mom's to make quilts for my siblings for Christmas. This was in 2005. My vision was to make the focal point of one of the quilts the front of the vest of a three-piece suit. I used white polyester fabric and the suits to make a checkerboard pattern. The center was framed, and I used the buttons from the suit to represent buttons on a shirt under the vest. I also used the faux pockets off the jacket and sewed them into the halfsquare blocks at the top corners. The other suit didn't have a vest, so I used the front of the pants as the center focal point and cut up the suit to emphasize the double white stitching throughout the quilt. These are the very first quilts I made I used fleece for the backing and tied them.

I dabbled with sewing quilts off and on while being mom, wife and working full time. I became more interested in quilting when I was working as a bus driver. I made friends with several ladies who also sewed quilts and quilted their own quilts on their domestic sewing machines. I learned so much about sewing patterns, thread basting and quilting them on my sewing machine. I quilted 25 to 30 quilts on a Walmart Singer sewing machine that I received as a gift from a dear friend of mine. I used it so much that it made horrible noises. I took it into T. Vidick to have it fixed. T. Vidick told me that I had to throw it in the trash because he

couldn't even use it for parts and there was no fixing it....I told him that I would have to have a funeral for my machine because we had been through so much together!!! I ended up throwing it away and purchasing another Singer.

God must have known that I needed a longarm quilter to quilt my quilts. I was introduced to Terri Eichhorst and Debbi Shenefelt, Silver Sisters Quilts, through a great mutual friend of ours at the Christmas Bazaar at the Catholic Church. I was working at the mine and was on the 28-day rotation. During one of my seven days off, Terri asked me if I would be able to help her with quilting quilts.

This was the beginning of a beautiful relationship!! Terri taught me how to operate the longarm to help her when she was running behind with clients. As Terri became busier, I helped her out more and more. In December 2016 my husband and I purchased a house with a walkout basement. Terri needed to move the business since her sister was selling her house. In October 2016 Silver Sisters Quilts moved into the basement of our house and that is when Heirlooms by Design and Silver Sisters started our working relationship!!

I say we are partners, but she has her business and I have mine. We have worked together for many years. Terri and Debbi had been approached by a Handi Quilter Regional Sales Manager to become a Handi Quilter Retailer; they declined the invitation.

In July 2017 I started my longarm business and in August 2017 Heirlooms by Design became a Handi Quilter Retailer. Retailer training began in November 2017. It was very educational for myself, Lyle (my husband) and Terri. Lyle took the tech training to be the Handi Quilter Tech for Heirlooms by Design; Terri and myself took the sales and retailer training to be able to sell and train customers on the Handi Quilter machines. We built our business out of our basement by vending at the N.E.W. Quilt Show and by word of mouth. I was able to bring in Handi Quilter National Educators to help me learn how to teach people how to use the longarm machines. At the end of 2019 we had several people interested in

purchasing Handi Quilter Machines but as 2020 took over our lives with the pandemic I was terrified that my business would be no longer...but boy, did God have plans for me!

As 2020 started off with craziness of the pandemic I was concerned that I would no longer be in business. As we all were told to stay home and quarantine from others that is when some people started going thru their closets and homes; deciding that they wanted those clothes saved from loved ones and old T-shirts saved from the glory days of high school made into a quilts or memory bears.

The Lord blessed me with a wonderful gift of being able to make custom quilts, memory bears and pillows for those who were left here on earth to live without those special people we loved so dearly. I became extremely busy with this business and quilting for others since they were home sewing also. I made so many masks. I hope never have to make another mask -- ever.

Once the pandemic started to lighten up with restrictions, I was able to bring in a Handi Quilter National Educator into the shop to have a hands-on event. With this event and vending at the N.E.W. Quilt Show I earned the HQ Way award which is a prestigious award that benefits customers and the shop with cool perks. I have earned this award for 2020 and 2021. I am working on keeping it this year.

As our business is growing, we were brought a wonderful opportunity to move into retail space with a wonderful array of space. Heirlooms by Design Quilt Shop has a wonderful size classroom that fits 10-12 students. It has a great space for Lyle to service machines and a wonderful space for the quilt shop.

We are a certified Handi Quilter Retailer Sales and Services. I love to bring in HQ National Educators to the community since this is an amazing way to learn new techniques and use the software on the Pro-Stitcher. We have expanded our service area into all machines except Bernina Sewing Machines, since we are not a dealer for them. We travel to set up machines that



My Grandma helped me to make my first quilt when I was about ten years old. We took a bed sheet and used iron-on transfers to put pictures all over it. Then I colored the pictures with liquid embroidery paints. We tied the quilt and I entered it into the fair and won a prize. After that, I made many soft, puffy, tied quilts. When I was about

25, I learned an amazing new thing...rotary cutting and piecing blocks! I quilted them with my domestic machine! I was in love!

My husband and I have nine children. Eight of them are boys. I'm pretty sure quilting is what kept me sane. I'm so thankful I had this wonderful hobby and a supportive husband through those years when they were all young and at home!



Quilting must be a big deal at our house. I just found out that when my oldest son was first getting to know his wife before they were married, he told her, "My dad and mom are Kenny and Deanna. She quilts."

My favorite part of quilting is long arm quilting. Deep down I'm an artist. I've been doing the long arm quilting for 11 years for people. I never want to stop!

In 2020, my husband gave me the attached garage to use as a quilt studio. We took the garage door out and made it into a lovely sewing room. I set up both of my Gammill long arms and started offering one for rent. One day at the end of 2021, I told my husband, "I come out here in the studio and work every day from 10:00 to 5:00, why not move into town and offer fabric for sale?!" And we started the process of opening a store in town. We opened April 5 and so far I am loving it!


A lot of people have asked about the name of my shop. We had a blue bike at the end of our driveway and I would tell customers who were bringing quilts to me to turn at the blue bike.



Campbell County Fair: Best Quilted Item - Carol Jahn (right). Best Embroidered Item - Irene Randall (top right).


The Thursday Stitchers have been busy every Thursday at the Campbell County Library. They meet from 9:00 until 2:00-3:00





and October 2nd.




