

Supplies:

- A small pile of scraps (to be shared in an in-person class): small-scale tone on tone prints, batiks, and neutrals, plus a few yarns and embellishments for hair
- Fat Quarters of: dark/med/light/lighter of one color (also to be shared in an in-person class)
- scrap of solid black fabric, scrap of solid white fabric (eyes, teeth, nostrils)
- Very sharp, pointy, fabric scissors, paper scissors
- Glue sticks and wet wipes (to clean glue off hands)
- A couple yards of baking parchment or silicone press sheets
- 1 yard of regular weight Wonder-Under or your favorite fusible web, unless you've pre-fused your fabrics. (Please no Heat-n-Bond)
- Sketchbook or plain paper, pencil, eraser, sharpie
- Optional: mini-iron and pressing surface
- Light box/table and tracing paper ([THIS LED light tablet](#) is lightweight and inexpensive. You can plug it into a phone charger so that you won't need an extension cord in a live class)
- Note: you do not need to have photos ready, Lyric will supply files for you to print to practice on.

OPTIONAL TECH INFO

This portion of class will be a demonstration only. Be advised that we don't have time to help you learn to use your particular phone or tablet.

We will be spending the last 1/2 hour of class learning how digital tools such as tablets and smartphones can make your portrait pattern making easier. These tools simply make what we do a little faster but are not necessary. You can implement everything we learn without them.

If you want to download Sketchbook, Snapseed, and Paper Camera(\$\$) you can work along with me but it is not necessary.

You will have access to video tutorials online so that you can really dig into the technology later.

Many of the Apps need you to configure permissions, such as allowing your camera to access the App. Don't be afraid to play around with each App before class and discover some of the things they can do. I promise you will be MUCH happier if you get a little practice in before class.

- Know how to turn on your device: I will not be able to help each individual in class turn on and configure their device
- Have your device fully charged
- On your device, open your App Store or Google Play and search for the app and download it
- Download **Sketchbook** on a tablet - it's not really useful on a phone

- Download Snapseed on a tablet or smartphone and open and play around with it **BEFORE CLASS**

If Paper Artist comes up, that is the same thing on Android and will work. (If you don't want to pay for the app, no worries. You can watch how we use it then decide if you want it.)
