




BOOKS FOR COUNTY LIBRARIES





CAROL JAHN - FEATURED QUILTER - The Accidental Quilter



Stars and Stripes

I became a quilter by accident. In the '60s (which really dates me), the local newspaper offered patterns for embroidery, crochet and garment sewing. The patterns cost only 10 cents or were sometimes free by sending a stamped self-addressed envelope. I liked to do hand embroidery and sent for a pattern that featured an embroidered block for the state flower for each of the 50 states. When I had completed all the embroidery, there were directions for sewing the blocks into a quilt top. The fabric for the sashing was bright pink, which I purchased at the local dime store. By following the instructions, I sewed the blocks together and had, quite accidentally, made my first quilt top!

At that time, I was teaching math in a small town in western Nebraska. I showed the quilt top to a coworker who said I should quilt the top. I had no idea how to do that but was put in touch with an older lady in town. She agreed to hand quilt my creation for \$40, quite a good price, even in the late '60s. I cherished that quilt but did not make another one for more than 30 years.

Fast forward to 2001 when I joined my church group in a charity project to make simple tied quilts. Another accident? Perhaps, or possibly destiny, because that sparked my interest, and I began sewing tops for the church and for myself. By 2007 I was teaching quilting classes at my local quilt shop. Over the years I have taught quilting classes at several quilt shops, WSQG events in Campbell County, Mallo Camp and Quilt Wyoming. Several of my quilts have won awards including Best in Show at the County Fair, Story Quilt

Show, and The Patti Knotts Award at the NEW quilt show.

Quilting is relaxing for me and I know some of the draw is the mathematical connection to my many years of teaching high school mathematics. I love planning the colors and fabrics for a new pattern, learning a new technique, and the surprise that comes when a secondary pattern is revealed. Quilts with hand embroidery, applique or a combination of both are some of my favorites. I have made quilts by paper piecing as well as by traditional piecing. Quilts that look three-dimensional but have achieved this effect by selecting and placing the fabrics by value are intriguing to me. Recently I made several one block wonder quilts, and enjoyed this technique.

I try to make at least one pattern from a variety of artists. Some of my favorites are: Jinny Beyer, Eleanor Burns, Judy Neimeyer, Morgan McCollough, Marci Baker, Elizabeth Hartman, Deb Tucker, Karen Combs, Maxine Rosenthal and Margot Languedoc.


Over the years I have used rulers and templates from a variety of manufacturers. Almost all of these are good, and many accomplish the same purpose. The Creative Grids products with the non-slip grip feature were an excellent improvement to correct slipping problems. The Studio 180 rulers which make the block oversized, to be trimmed down, have improved the accuracy for many of us.

My advice for other quilters would be to keep trying new patterns and techniques. Take as many classes as you can. Follow the pattern directions and if possible, use the ruler or tool recommended. Your brain needs stimulus, and what better way than to try something new.

I joined WSQG in either 2005 or 2006. Although I became a quilter accidentally, there is nothing accidental about my love for learning new techniques, attending classes, meeting other quilters. Quilt Wyoming is an opportunity to do all of these and have a great time.







WE HOPE YOU WILL HAVE FUN SOLVING THIS MYSTERY!

CLUE #1

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric 1 - (Main Fabric) 2-2/3 yards of a nondirectional print with light or dark background and motifs including at least three additional colors.

Fabric 2 - 2 yards, strong medium tone to match one of the colors in a motif of the main fabric.

Fabric 3 - 1-1/8 yards medium color to match another motif of the main fabric

Fabric 4 - 1/2 yard contrasting medium color (may be darker or lighter than other fabrics)

Cutting Instructions:

(Label each set with number and size - Keep scraps, just in case!)

From Fabric 1 - Cut 6 strips 6-1/4" by width of fabric (WOF) - Subcut into 36 squares 6-1/4"

Cut 5 strips 4" by WOF - Subcut into 48 squares 4"

Cut 3 strips 4-3/8" by WOF - Subcut into 24 squares 4-3/8"

Cut 7 strips 2-3/8" by WOF
Cut 4 squares 4-1/2" from remainder.

From Fabric 2 - Cut 4 strips 4-1/2" by 72" length of fabric (LOF)

From remaining piece, cut 8 strips 2-3/8" by WOF (approximately 22")

Cut 2 strips 4-3/8" WOF and subcut into 8 squares 4-3/8"

Cut 8 squares 4" from remainder

From Fabric 3 - Cut 5 strips 2-3/8" by WOF

Cut 8 strips 2-1/2 by WOF

Cut 8 squares 4" from remainder

From Fabric 4 - Cut 2 strips 4-3/8" by WOF - Subcut into 16 squares 4-3/8"

Cut 3 strips 2-3/8" by WOF.


