Jan DeBolt was instrumental in forming the Wyoming State Quilt Guild. She served as WSQG Treasurer from 1998-2001. Many of us have fond memories of Jan as a friend and as a teacher. She spoke out for the good of the guild. Many members were present to celebrate Jan's life in Lingle, WY, on August 29th.

When Jancy took her mother to see the Hospice of Laramie, Jan's reaction was, "I am staying!" The family of residents have the option to decorate and personalize the outer room. Even though Jan passed 72 hours after relocating, this picture shows Jan's tribute from her family.



Jancy told me that Hospice of Laramie gives each resident a quilt. They need more. She suggested that if anyone wishes

Jan was on oxygen for over 30 years. When asked how she was going to continue to teach, her response was "I will get a longer hose!" In class she referred to herself as "Jan the Ripper". She had a twinkle in her eye and a sharp sense of humor. We received the following letter from daughter,

To the members of WSQG,

Thanks to each of you for the friendship you shared with our mom, Jan DeBolt. She was proud of the organization she helped found. I was honored to accompany her to the 25th anniversary in Sheridan where I was able to put faces to the names I had heard her mention so many times.

My sister and I had four years of our own quilt retreats with mom where she taught us techniques for bowtie, paper piecing, Seminole strips, half bias squares, and (the dreaded, by me) Bargello. We made table runners by quilting as we go and also learned card tricks. Our last trip we made Mary's triangles. Mom and I shared a class from John Flynn.

We promised her we would continue her love of quilting and to share it with her great grandchildren.

I am enclosing some memorial donations made in Mom's behalf.

She is now free to breathe and free from toting around the oxygen tanks that were her constant companion for nearly three decades.

Sheila Pecha - Featured Quilter



My sewing journey began when I was about 13 years old when I entered junior high (7th grade). Home Economics was a required class that we had to take. I literally fell in love with the sewing machine. Clothing construction was all that was taught. I took a sewing class every semester through my senior year of high school including tailoring. I received my Bachelor of Science degree in Home Economics at the University of Wyoming, although upon graduation I never pursued a job in the field. Throughout college my summer job was as an alteration lady in a local clothing store, and I did continue to make clothing garments for many years.

When I got married and started my family, I didn't have much time for a lot of sewing. When my children began school my time became looser and a girlfriend talked me into taking a class at the local quilt shop. It was a very simple table runner class. This was the beginning of a whole new way to sew. One class led to another until I finally attempted a large king-size quilt in a class that Patti Knotts taught. Oh my, after that I was really hooked. That quilt won "best in show" at the Campbell County Fair the year I entered it. So, pretty much the rest is history. I'm sure my story is not much different than most everyone who starts quilting.

I don't quilt to sell any of my work, and it continues to pile up, but it's a hobby that I enjoy doing. It's a way to keep my brain active and to be creative. I suspect my children will inherit all my stuff and they will have to figure out what to do with it. I hope they will see it as an heirloom and treasure my creations. As with most all quilters I'm a member of the SABLE club. (Stash Accumulation Beyond Life Expectancy). My cousin is in my "will" to receive my "stash" and vice versa. I am starting to make smaller baby-size quilts as I get grandchildren. They are also easier to make and less cumbersome.

A few years ago, I went with the group of 100 women in two buses to the Paducah quilt expo that Jennifer Golden put together. In rummaging through the vendor hall, I found Jodi Barrow's "Square in a Square" system and found it to be an extremely interesting process of quilting. I bought her two basic books and rulers and I have joined her program and am learning her system, via the internet with online teaching and classes. It's a very forgiving way to make any kind of block imaginable with the knowledge of the "options" that are learned with the system in what Jodi Barrows calls working around the "human element" with the cutting, sewing, and pressing. Almost all seam allowances and points come out perfect. I would so love to have her or one of her assistants be a featured teacher at our WSQG annual meeting and retreat.

My biggest struggle is fabric selection within the specific quilt project to make that "wow" quilt. I've made a few not-so-great items that just do not look the best, as I'm sure is not unusual for many quilt makers. I tend to look frequently at kits, since the fabrics are pre-selected and you know what it will look like finished, but that doesn't use up the stash.

I enjoy going to retreats and hanging out with "like-minded" sewers. At these retreats I generally prefer to sew on my own projects rather than take a class and start other projects, unless they have a technique that intrigues me. I'm only interested in doing the piece work. My go-to quilter is our beloved *Patchwords* newsletter editor, Virginia Ohr. Her quilting work is so beautiful, and I look forward to many more projects of my work being quilted by her.








The Basin Arts Center had their First Annual Quilt Show in July. A nice beginning with many antique quilts on display.

MYSTERY QUILT - CLUE #2


Big as a Mountain

You should have the quilt cut out and ready to begin sewing.

Follow the quilt clues to create an easy and fun quilt top that measure 60" x 70".

The final clue will be in the February-March 2024 Patchwords. Plan to share a picture of your finished

blocks along the way on Facebook or in Patchwords. Hopefully we will have several finished quilts on display at Quilt Wyoming 2024 and in an issue of Patchwords.



WE HOPE YOU WILL HAVE FUN SOLVING THIS MYSTERY!

Block A -- Using eight of the 4-3/8" squares of both fabrics #1 and #2, place one 4-3/8" square of fabric #1 on a 4-3/8" square of fabric #2, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on the wrong side of one square. Sew scant seam 1/4" away from drawn line on each side. Cut on line. Press to darker fabric. Repeat with remaining seven squares, creating a total of 16 half-square triangle blocks measuring 4" square.

Layout -- Select one 4" square of fabric #3. Lay right side up. Place four 4" squares of fabric #1 on each side of that fabric #3 square. In the corners add a half-square triangle block with the 90-degree point of the triangle of fabric #2 touching fabric #3. Sew block together. Make four blocks. Square to 11" and label the Block A.

Block B -- Using 16 of the 4-3/8" squares of fabric #1 and of fabric #4, use the same technique as in Block A to create 32 half-square triangle blocks. Press to the darker fabric.

Layout -- Place a 4" square of fabric #2 on the table, right side up. Place a 4" square of fabric #1, so each has one corner touching a corner of fabric #2. Place one half-square triangle block in each space created with one edge of #4 touching the right edge of square #1 and the top of center square #2. Working around the block, place the remaining three half-square triangles to form a star. Check to make sure as you rotate the block, that the top star points always look the same. Sew. Press to solid squares and away form center row.

Make eight blocks. Square to 11" and label the Block B.


