Last, but not least.... Happiness is catchy. Spread it around





# **FEATURED QUILTER - Joan Neumiller**



I, Joan Pellatz Neumiller was born at the Camp Douglas Hospital in Converse County before the County had a true hospital of it's own. I recall mom and dad tying 'quilts' on the kitchen table at the ranch near Bill, WY. Some of them had Dad's wool Army blankets as the batting. I have two of those tied scrappy quilts.

Now I make scrappy quilts from remnant left overs from other projects and even the trimmings from quilt backs.

I can remember going to Dry Creek Homemaker meetings with my mother and grandmother. The ladies would sometimes quilt on a large wooden quilt frame. Some of us little girls would play dolls under the frame. It was such a social affair!

My affection with a needle and thread probably started with embroidery at a very young age I still have two napkins I made in first grade. I got my very own hand-crank sewing machine sometime in the early 1950's. Mom's machine was a Singer treadle and I had to dust it. Maybe that is why I struggle to dust things to this day!

My family got electricity to our house in 1962. Then Mom got an electric sewing machine which I have. This machine is what I sewed on until I got married. My first machine was a new 1968 portable Singer which was utilized to make aprons, tea towels, dresses, make-it-yourself with wool, slacks, blouses, and skirts. Some fabric was from flour sacks bought at the Wyoming Wool Warehouse in Rock Springs.

In 7th grade we girls had a craft day Mrs. Beard taught us hand piecing and quilting. We made pot holders.

When in Junior high I started embroidering the state flowers for my high school graduation quilt. The high school graduation quilt was completed by me with the last binding stitch completed on the 25th anniversary of graduation!

My mom and I hand quilted it on my handmade frame, built by my dad. I have always sewn clothing for my family. Polyester was such a popular fabric in the 60's and 70's.

My serious cotton quilting journey began in 1975 when I visited a store in Colorado Springs and found a class making Sun Bonnet Sue and Overall Sam, pillows, at the Coach and Four Limited Quilt Shop.

I continued to make pillows and quilts for my daughter and son. I also made lots of lap quilts for my parents and us.

I signed up for classes and had great social fun at Jean's Fabrics in Allendale in the early 1980's. Then I took classes from Sherry Fink. I met one of my best friends there, Marcia Davis. We still quilt together with the Cutups in Casper

While I have not attended all of the Quilt Wyomings, they are my favorite. I have also camped and quilted with friends in Colorado and South Dakota.

I have quilted at Lincoln, NE, at the National Quilting Seminars. I have been a member of the National Quilt Society, the American Quilting Society and the Colorado Quilt Council.

I have enjoyed the Sisters Quilt Show in Oregon, and I have attended the International Quilt Festival in Houston.

The Wyoming State Fair is my favorite show. I have exhibited there for many years. I had the honor of being awarded Reserve Champion one year. I received the award for Premier Exhibitor in 2019. I was presented a Janome sewing machine for my

arrowhead quilt in 2021. That was made from a class at Quilt Wyoming in Cheyenne, taught by Kimberly Einmo, quilted by Virginia Ohr.

With all the quilts that I have made, one of my favorites is White Chocolate. I took it to the NEW Quilt Show in Gillette. It won the Patty Knotts Best Workmanship award! What an honor!

You might say I am an avid quilter and so enjoy the whole process. I just might have ten projects in process at any time.


You know a quilter lives at my house when you see my backsplash above my stove. This was inspired by Gail Garber.





# 2024 Quilt Exhibit- Gloria L. Greenlee - Old University Building Nacogdoches, Texas



2024 Quilt Exhibit Gloria L. Greenlee Old University Building Nacogdoches, Texas

Gloria L. Greenlee was born December 27, 1932, in Ada, OK. She lived with her parents, Leo and Jewel Faust, until she married in June 1952 to James E. Abbott of Ada, OK. Gloria was the middle of three daughters and it was during her childhood that she began her appreciation for fabric, design and handwork. She learned embroidery and basic sewing techniques at home, developed her knowledge during Home Economics courses, and began sewing many of her own clothes during late high school. As valedictorian of Stonewall High School and two years of college, focused on mathematics, Gloria's attention to learning to precision, and to exceptional performance were recognized. These traits defined her vocation and avocation across her adult life.

Gloria accompanied her husband who was in the US Air Force across the nation, first living near the base in Denver, then in Florida, followed by California. Upon her husband's discharge from the military, the couple settled in Tulsa, OK, where James began working for American Airlines as a mechanic. Gloria continued to

develop her skills, sewing her clothes and creating items to decorate her home. When children came, she made their clothes as well. In addition to her continuation with embroidery, she learned to crochet and to knit. Perhaps not surprisingly, both crochet and knitting resulted in clothing and home decor items, including afghan blankets. All sewing and handwork were accompanied as after-work and weekend endeavors. Gloria worked fulltime across her adult years in bookkeeping, accounting, and employee benefits, rising to leadership roles during her last 15 years of employment.

Retiring at age 50, in 1982. Gloria had more time to pursue her interests in photography, gardening, sewing and handwork. In about 1984 Gloria took up guilt work, about the time that guilts were being considered as art. This concept of quilt-as-art was intriguing and she began to read and study quilting techniques. She joined the Tulsa Quilt Guild where she found a group of like-minded women--women who thought of quilts and quilting as artistic expression. She thrived in this group of women developing her knowledge, her skills, and artistic expressions. She also rose to leadership roles at the local and state levels.

In 1993, Gloria and her second husband, Jim Greenlee, moved to Cheyenne, WY Though saddened to leave Tulsa, Gloria found a new group of like-minded women at the Cheyenne Heritage Quilt Guild. The artistry of members of the Cheyenne and the Wyoming State Quilt Guilds continued to inspire Gloria and the excellence of her quilts increased. She gave lectures, taught classes and participated in historic registrations of antique and contemporary quilts. While in Cheyenne, Gloria also rose to leadership roles at the local and state levels.

Gloria and her husband moved to Texas in 2005, first living in Bandera and then moving to Nacogdoches in 2014. Though there was no established quilt guild iin Bandera, quilting was thriving across the Texas Hill County. Gloria kept up her quilting, teaching and leadership during this time in Bandera and for a couple of years in Nacogdoches. In all, Gloria has made over 200 quilts of various sizes (wall hangings, crib, lap and bed quilts). Now at age 91, she is no longer producing quilts but she continues to appreciate the artistry of others and to share her work with family and friends.
