## Purdy Bird Class taught by Deonn Stott

This is such a fun quilt with lots of techniques, but in small doses so it's entirely manageable. There is not a lot of prep to do, other than to select your fabrics and have them pressed and ready to cut in class. See the attached coloring sheet for you to try out your colors and get a preview how your quilt will look.

The price is $\$ 10 €$ which equals $\$ 9$ or 10 US dollars. Download and print at home, a print shop or library. The pattern makes a $56^{\prime \prime} \times 56^{\prime \prime}$ quilt. If you prefer to reduce or enlarge the pattern, then you can print the pattern the size you'd like. I reduced my first one $50 \%$ to fit on the wall of my bathroom, about $28^{\prime \prime} \times 28^{\prime \prime}$ finished.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS: (Small quilt requirements in parentheses)
Main Print, Bird Body: $1 / 2$ yard (1/4 yard or 1 Fat Quarter)
Coordinating prints: 5 Fat Quarters (5 Fat Eighths - $9 \times 22$ " rectangles)
Background: 2-1/2 yards (1-1/4 yards)
Binding: $1 / 2$ yard ( $1 / 4$ yard)
Backing 3-1/2 yards (1 yard)
Helpful tool: Add-A-Quarter ruler from CM Designs. I will have some on hand to try or buy in class.

Additional supplies: Tableside rotary cutting equipment (small mat, ruler, cutter); matching thread. Washable glue stick. Bring an empty cereal box or a sheet of mylar template plastic to create your applique templates, paper scissors, and a pencil for tracing. Another handy tool is a pair of pinking shears - bring those if you have them.
