The resulting quilts are contemporary works, set in this time and place, which reference the rich tradition of quilt making." CLASS INFORMATION

HOW DO I RATE MY SKILL LEVEL?

Beginner: I have little or no experience with quilt making or sewing. I have not used or have little experience using a sewing machine.

Advanced Beginner: I have experience with a rotary cutter, rulers, squares, and piecing, and/or have basic sewing skills and knowledge. I have completed at least one or two quilting projects using a sewing machine.

Intermediate: I am comfortable with interpreting patterns, and designs, and have made several quilts. I have a good working knowledge of a sewing machine.

Advanced: I am comfortable with all levels of designing, sewing, and creating quilts. I have excellent working knowledge of using a sewing machine.

QUILT WYOMING 2024 CLASSES¹ THURSDAY – JULY 11, 2024

1. Ilene Bartos: Stacked Ovals



Learn an easy trapunto method using batting for a fun 3-D look. Kits will be available for purchase.

2. Brigit Gail Dermott: Playing with Shapes



Let's play with shapes! In this class, students will create improv quilt tops using basic shapes including half-square triangles, half-rectangle triangles, flying geese, and drunkards path.

Students will arrange these shapes to tell a visual story. We'll discuss working with scale, color, and negative space to create a harmonious design, and examples of designs that feature arranged shapes such as Sanna Annukka (Marimekko designer), Otomi artwork, and others will be reviewed for inspiration. Students will sew their shape blocks, spend time playing on the design wall to create their unique design, and then will start piecing their quilt tops. Each student will finish class with a unique design and all the blocks needed to complete their project at home. Students should know how to piece basic

shapes as the focus will be on designing and piecing the quilt top.

3. Timna Tarr: Circling Your Way around Color Wheel



Learn how to make this very happy quilt while also having a great time! We start the workshop by playing with fabrics and color to help us loosen up our color muscles. Timna will then teach five (or more!) techniques on how to make perfect circles, using both hand and machine techniques. Come prepared to play, experiment, and have fun. Supply fee of \$5 payable to instructor.

4. Lauren Andrist: Big Star Lap – 2 Day Class (Th & F, 24) Large Lap Quilt, 71" x 71", using your favorite fat quarters to create a colorful arrangement around a large center star. \$15 pattern fee payable to instructor.All Levels.



5. Kim Hicks: Scrappy Little Basket – 2 Day Class (Th & F, 25)


This quilt can be made from 5" to 8" squares with no fabric waste. The background should be very neutral so it does not compete with the basket design. Size will vary depending upon the size of the squares. A supply list and cutting instructions will be sent to class attendees prior to QW24. All Levels



6. Di Wilsey Geer: Floor Quilt – 2 Day Class (Th & F, 26) The floor and your creative imagination are the limit as we create beautiful floor quilts. From your stash or local quilt shop, you can turn your fabrics into durable walkable pieces of art. If you think Barn Quilts are fun, you'll learn that Floor Quilts are the bomb! This is a no sewing technique that can later be applied to make coasters, placemats, luggage tags, bookmarks and more. Kit Fee \$12 payable to instructor. Advanced Beginner

7. Robin Lynn Dempsey: Mystery Bargello THIS CLASS IS CLOSED.

Mystery Bargello! Let's have some fun! This is a class for everyone – beginner and experienced quilter alike. All you need is a jelly roll, a little bit of yardage and an open mind! Trust that we will have a great day of sewing, learning, and socializing. Oh, and of course, snacking! I promise you will not be disappointed with your project! The first "clue" will be the supply list you receive after you sign up. The remainder will be revealed at the class. All Levels



8. Josy Daniel: Greenbelt This is a fantastic class to introduce the Studio 180 Design tools. Beginners will be able to make very accurate half square triangles in a couple different sizes for this design. I will show you 5 different ways to layout the blocks. I am sure you will find one design that you will love. Level: Advanced Beginner plus

9. Connie Dilts: Exploding Stars Exploding Stars, 30" x 30", pattern uses the <u>Creative Grids Half Rectangle Trim Tool</u> to make a stunning quilt for your wall or table. This class will demonstrate how to make successful 4 patch blocks, and to use the trim tool to make half rectangles. Tips will be given throughout the class, including sewing, pressing, pinning and how to finish a quilt top with confidence. Advanced Beginner



10. Jennifer Golden: Caramel Latte There will be fun using precuts to make this quilt. It is easy and a relaxing sewing experience. Beginner



11. Barb Gorges: Remembering Your Quilt... Especially if you give away your quilts, explore ways to remember them: journal, scrapbook, Excel sheet. Documentation helps you remember patterns and techniques used (and the names and dates of all those special, quiltworthy people and occasions). Bring one of your quilts to class and try out different documentation ideas after the lecture. All Levels



12. Janet Hoxie: Wool & Mixed Media This class will take quilting supplies, embroidery and beading supplies and super-secret supplies and use techniques borrowed from other crafts to create one-of-a-kind masterpieces. We will dye, paint, create, and embellish. No Sewing Machine Needed.

\$15 Kit required from instructor. Intermediate



13. Deonn Stott: Purdy Bird Here's a fun, modern quilt that comes together quickly using a mixed bag of skill-building quilting techniques: curved piecing, paper-piecing and easy. Intermediate



14. Denise Fried: Colorway This quilt uses a layer cake, coordinating or matching jelly roll and background fabric. Let's have fun making the colorway of your choice. Intermediate/Advanced

15. Kathleen Moorhead Johnson: Exploding Heart Capture the feeling of your heart bursting with joy. A fat quarter friendly project or a scrappy adventure with several variations. Intermediate



16. Patricia Heintz: Watch Chain This quilt uses a modified four patch to make linked chains that remind us of the chain on pocket watches. We use Deb Tucker's Studio 180 Four Patch Square Up tool. Advanced Beginner



17. Lauren Rogers: Scrappy Bear Paw with twist Let's use up some leftovers!! Grab strips and squares and let's get to scrappin'. (Unless you are making it a planned scrappy). The pattern we created will be supplied. Shortcuts and tricks to make the block square is a large part of the experience. This can be lots of fun and everyone will be different. Advanced Beginner to Advanced



18. Becky Riley: Color Selection Confidence– $\frac{1}{2}$ Day Class This is an interactive lecture and workshop exploring how to apply color theories to fabric selection and quilting. In other words, students will use colored pencils to have fun with color! All Levels



19. Katie Rapp: Beginner – 2 Day Class (Th-F, 39) This class will teach the beginner quilter about fabrics, supplies, how to cut, sew, and press accurately. Students will be able to get blocks made during the first day and learn to connect the blocks into a quilt top during the 2nd day of class. We will also discuss how to finish the quilt. There will be a quilting and binding demonstration.

21. Ilene Bartos: Fall Leaf

Learn how to enhance a simple leaf shape with fun techniques, including raw-edged applique, satin stitching, herky-jerky quilting, foiling, beading, and making a copper wire hanger. Kits and hanger supplies will be available for purchase.



22. Brigit Gail Dermott: Pixel Postage Stamp

The postage stamp pixel quilt uses a simple grid of one-inch squares to make a subtle picture. Students will plan (or color) their pixel designs using graph paper and colored pencils or markers. We will discuss how to use color value to accentuate the effect of the pixels. (Students will also have the option to use pre-planned designs including a heart or a rainbow.) Students will then jump into cutting and piecing, focusing on foundational skills including cutting with precision and piecing using a scant quarter-inch seam. Students will make good progress on their quilt tops in the workshop and leave with all the skills needed to complete their projects.



23. Timna Tarr: Map Making with Fabric Use fabric to capture a special location. Maybe it's your favorite vacation spot, your neighborhood, or your hometown. Over the course of the workshop, participants learn both pattern-making and improvisational quilting techniques to create personal map quilts. Bring a large paper map of a location you would like to replicate, approx. 8.5"x11". Your paper map will be the approximate size of the finished piece. Also bring your favorite fabrics and threads and a willingness to experiment. Mark your place in the world!

27. Judy Powell: Impatiens – 2 Day Class (F & Sat, 48) We will be making a set of 18" placemats using paper-piecing. Students will learn the basics of paper-piecing and how to sort papers to make it easy to follow.



28. Josy Daniel: Star Shadows This is great project to learn about the Wing Clipper Tool by Studio 180 Designs. You will learn to make very accurate flying geese 4 at a time. You will make the illusion of stars floating above the ground and casting shadows below. Make a small quilt or a table runner with the wing clipper tool. Required Supplies: Studio 180 Designs Wing Clipper Tool reg. \$30 - QW24 \$27 Magic Wand reg \$8 - QW24 \$5 Pattern reg. \$12.40 - QW24 \$10 Instructor will have the wing clipper, wand, and pattern for sale at QW prices plus tax for cash or checks.

29. Connie Dilts: Pumpkin Patch Finished Size 6 ½" x 18 ½" This class will teach the basic techniques for hand sewing wool applique including using a variety of threads and needles, basic embroidery stitches, the use of beads, using freezer paper, tips when using small wool pieces and finishing techniques. Required: \$14 Material fee per student that includes pattern, some threads, needles, and other hand sewing supplies. Payable in class. Optional Kit: \$16- Instead of bringing your own wool and cotton fabrics, some threads and other hand sewing supplies. Partial kits are available if requested. No sewing machine necessary





30. Jennifer Golden: Poly Rope Bowl All the bowls and baskets we will make are created from boat rope using simple coiling methods and zig-zag stitching. It will be fun and relaxing. We will create several bowls with individual design and color. Level: Beginner



31. Deb Kipp: Double Cut Layer Cake Do you have an extra Layer Cake? This is the class for you! Easy and quick with just one block made 36 times! All skill levels \$8.00 pattern payable to instructor.

32. Janet Hoxie: Mystery Quilt Everybody loves a mystery, and this one is no exception. Prepare to be mystified, and then amazed as you create a special quilt, table runner, lap quilt or wall hanging. Once the mystery is revealed, full instructions will be provided to complete the quilt at home or your next retreat. Intermediate



- 33. Deonn Stott: Bindings <u>LECTURE</u> ½ Day Class: In a bind when it comes to binding a quilt? This class will arm you with ideas to help finish your quilts with flair! The class highlights binding basics and solves the mystery of that elusive final seam! Learn tricks to master scalloped or curvy edges, odd-angled inside and outside corners, and more! We will try to explore alternative finishes such as scallops, prairie points, "invisible" faced binding, faux-piping, and even chenille! All Levels
- 34. Deonn Stott: Bindings WORKSHOP ½ Day Class: Beginner to Advanced Hands-on binding workshop. KIT, \$18 (Optional—order from instructor). Includes quilted placemat and sample strip, plus pre-cut coordinating fabrics.



35. Denise Fried: Scrap Box Chevron A Great way to use up scrapes! Intermediate/Advanced



36. Kathleen Moorhead Johnson: Aunt Jo's Afghan This striking pattern looks like a crocheted afghan. Small pieces are used to make these fun blocks, for a quilt that will have you doing a double take and checking to see if it is a quilt or an afghan! Intermediate



37. Patricia Heintz: Bougainvillea You'll have fun working with this planned color scheme, making big blocks, and then adding more interest by double popping the corners to create something unique. Required tools: Studio 180 Trimmer I and Corner Pop II Intermediate



38. Lauren Rogers: Flipping Out Case This is a great case to store and transport your pens, pencils, and other sewing tools as you travel. Using a foam stabilizer to create a nice firm case with a zipper. Grab that awesome print that you love to make this case. Finished size will be 14.5" H, 5.5" D and 5.5" W. Any of these supplies can be purchased at Backdoor Quilt Shoppe. With advance notice, I can also bring items with me to the class. Advanced Beginner – Advanced

39. Katie Rapp: Beginner – 2 Day Class (Th-F, 19) Register for Day 2 of 2



40. Becky Riley: Dresden Plate The Dresden Plate is a very old block with many fun applications. She will use the Creative Grids Dresden Plate tool, or any Dresden Plate tool you might have. Students will explore several techniques and options for creating the center of the plate, and students can choice from a runner, table topper, hot pad, bed runner or beginning a quilt. Advanced Beginner - Advanced

41. OPEN SEW

SATURDAY – JULY 13, 2024



42. Ilene Bartos: Cracked Boxes This small wall hanging (or table topper) has a modern flair and is done with simple straight, sewing then using my "no mistakes" method to cut the angled sections. Kits will be available for purchase.



43. Brigit Gail Dermott: Big Top Quilt

This is a complicated wedge-based pattern that uses foundation paper piecing, templates, curved piecing and giant blocks! I will walk the participants through the pattern and explain some of the unusual techniques that result in this truly unique quilt. We will talk about how to use color to quiet or enliven the design with a demonstration of different color schemes and quilts that use solids and prints. Participants will complete one wedge in the class, giving them all the skills they need to complete the pattern.



44. Timna Tarr: Stitched Mosaics

Create photorealistic quilts one square at a time in this one-day workshop. Learn the techniques that make up Timna's Noble Menagerie Series of animal quilts. Using a photo provided, students will learn the process of making a fabric mosaic using turned edge machine applique. We will break down the construction process, explore color and value as design elements, and learn how to choose the right fabric for the right location. Students will use their own fabric, so each leaf will be unique! Project finishes at 8"x11". Best for intermediate level quilters. Supply fee of \$10 payable to instructor.



45. Patricia Hall: English Buttons This class focuses on the techniques used to make various classic, traditional buttons that originated in England. These buttons can be used to adorn quilts, clothing, handbags, pillows, and even jewelry!

\$12 kit fee payable to instructor. Advanced Beginner - Advanced



46. Robin Lynn Dempsey: Day Dreamer Dare to Daydream! This whimsical, modern quilt is quick to go together and is a "dream" to do. Just pick your favorite colors and a neutral background. Intermediate



47. Katie Rapp: Beginning Paper Piecing This class will teach the <u>confident</u> beginner quilter about paper piecing. Students will be introduced to different paper piecing techniques and some tools available to help with paper piecing. This is a no stress class that produces crisp results.

48. Judy Powell: Impatiens – 2 Day Class (F & Sat, 27) Register for Day 2 of 2



49. Josy Daniel: Argyle Put an old fashion pattern in your new quilt. Looks complicated but it goes fast once you learn the technique for piecing setting triangles. Can you figure out where the block starts and ends? Intermediate Required Tools: by Studio 180 Design Wedge Star reg. \$45.50 QW \$40.00 Argyle Pattern reg. \$12.40 QW \$10.00 All items may be purchased from instructor at the QW24 prices plus tax with cash or checks only please.



50. Connie Dilts: Morning Brew Mug Rug $-\frac{1}{2}$ Day Class This class will teach how to make a fun small wool mug rug. It will teach the components of using felted wool. It will use simple embroidery stitches, beads, and show an example of how to accurately embroider lines on the wool. Project will be close to being completed by the end of class. Material fee -\$14 per student that includes the pattern, some threads, freezer paper, Press and Seal and needles. Payable in class. Optional kit- \$12 per student that includes wool, beads, threads, Press and Seal, and other sewing supplies. Partial kits are available if requested in advance.



51. Jennifer Golden: Chandelier This quilt will surprise you! It looks way more complicated than it is. Choose fabric that you love and it will turn into one of your favorite quilts. Intermediate



52: Angela McPherson: Watercolors Students will learn several watercolor pencil techniques to use on fabric along with suggestions for other projects. A technique sheet has been printed on fabric from Spoonflower to start the student with 9+ techniques. Two preembroidered fabric designs will be used with watercolor paint using the techniques taught. Students will choose from a group of pre-stitched embroidery designs to encourage learned techniques and creative painting. Required Kit cost \$45 from the instructor. Advanced Beginner to Advanced. The photo is an example of the techniques.




