Most recent job: University of Wyoming, Laramie County Extension Horticulturist 2002 to 2023.

I have managed everything from landscape construction projects to adult learning classes and conferences. I have been on numerous committees with various positions throughout the years. Outside of work; recent committees include: the Tuesday Farmers Market/ Cheyenne, The Cheyenne Winter Farmers Market (since inception in 2009), committee chair Laramie County Master Gardens Bare Root Tree and Shrub committee. 




FEATURED QUILTER - Rose Marie Karlin French



When I was young, my paternal grandmother, Rosina Wiseburger Karlin, who was poor, had bags of scraps given to her by people from her Baptist Church. From the scraps she made quilts, pot holders, and stuffed toys. Sometimes she made her own patterns. She didn't have any money to buy patterns.

With her treasured scrap bags in brown paper she would let my sister Kathy and I take those scraps and make quilts and doll clothes. We were about five and six, I being the oldest.

Now as an adult, I realize what a gift I was given. Grandma was the first quilter I was acquainted with. From that beginning, I was quite a prolific quilter.

It is hard for me to say what I enjoy most about quilting. I enjoy everything! I enjoy hand applique, placing the pieces on a blank background, coming up with a bouquet of flowers. I pray and meditate while hand quilting. I guess hand



quilting is my favorite part of quilting.

My first quilt was an Irish chain quilt in browns and creams with baby farm animals in the background. It was made for my son, John. (It still isn't complete!) I am a perfectionist and I could not pull the huge knot in from the back, LOL! The quilt was made 44 years ago. I thought I would finish it for his first child. My grand daughters are five and seven. OOPS!!

Over the last 44 years I have received many awards from Park County Fair and State Fair. I have received many Grand Champion ribbons and Best of Show ribbons. My greatest honors have been at the Rapid City Quilt Show. Last year I received first place for hand quilting. I won a sewing machine at the Wyoming Sate Fair for the best entry. I won money at a quilt show in Texas. Out of 400 quilts I won the award for Best Entry.

There are a couple people who have inspired me. The first person would be my sister, Kathy Crane. She and I have had the opportunity to take the Baltimore Brides seminars in Williamsburg, Virginia, Rockwall, Texas and Baltimore On the Prairie in Nebraska City, Nebraska. Kathy takes hand applique to a professional level.



Sue Garmen is the second person who inspires me. She designed many hand applique patterns. Many are Baltimore Brides quilts. I had the opportunity to take one of her classes before she passed away. Look her up on the internet!

My favorite tools are a sand board, Bohin quilting needles, size 9. I like Sewline pencils. I also like thimbles that are custom made by TJ Lane. I like size 10 embroidery needles by Scarlet Today and size 7 embroidery needles by

Piecemakers. I use fine glass head pins by Clover. For basting I use heavy quilting thread and for applique I use 60-weight Mettler thread and DMC thread on the spool. It can be difficult to find. I use a light board to place the pieces on the background and for piecing the pattern on the background. Last, but not least, I use blunt-end and sharpend scissors by Kai. They are four inches long.

I am a traditional quilter. I prefer Baltimore Brides quilts. My favorite designers and authors are Kathy Delaney, Janice Vaine and Margaret Docherty. These designers use hand appliqué techniques for their quilts. I also like many of the older Better Homes and Gardens publications.



As far as advice goes, the sky is the limit! Sue Garman gave me the best advice, "It's your quilt, do as you want it to be."

I have been a member of WSQG on and off for years. I am a very social person. I enjoy number one, the people, and number two, the classes. We have had some amazing teachers at Quilt Wyoming.





The Fall Friends and Company Retreat will be Oct. 16 to 20 at the Holiday Inn in Cody.


