WSQG QUILT WYOMING SCHOLARSHIPS

At Quilt Wyoming 2024 the question was asked "How did the scholarship originate?"

The decision to award scholarships was decided by the WSQG Board in 2010. The purpose was to give back to membership by providing funding assistance for a member to attend Quilt Wyoming. In 2018 it was decided to begin awarding two scholarships each year.

Since 2010, 22 \$200 scholarships have been awarded to WSQG members. Names are drawn at Quilt Wyoming. The recipient receives a certificate to present the following year, for credit against that Quilt Wyoming. The winner must be present for the drawing. The scholarships are not transferrable.

The winners of the two scholarships for 2024 are Maria Viking, Rock Springs, and Cindi Young, Cheyenne.

When Founding Member Jan Debolt passed away on August 11, 2023, her family suggested donations be made to Laramie Hospice House, WSQG or PEO, Chapter AI. Many members donated to WSQG in Jan's memory. The Board decided to use these funds to encourage young quilters by providing a scholarship each year for three years. The winner of the first scholarship award at Quilt Wyoming 2024 was Makayla Haptonstall, Scotts Bluff, NE.

WSQG member **Kay Talkington** passed away in June 2024. According to her daughter, April Pendleton, when Kay heard about the Jan Debolt scholarship she expressed a desire to offer a scholarship to assist other quilters in a similar way. April presented a check to the board at Quilt Wyoming 2024 to initiate this scholarship for the next five years. The recipient in 2024 of the first Kay Talkington scholarship is Carol Kolf, Sheridan.
