Many thanks to all who entered items including WSQG members whose entries supported and beautified the exhibit hall. Many visitors made comments about what a wonderful quilt and needlework show it was. It was great to see many WSQG members come to the show as well!

The Super Senior class has become quite popular with a huge variety of entries. Anna, the WSF Quilt Superintendent noted that there were more first-time entries than in previous years. New classes, which made it into the premium book this year, included Quilts of Valor, with judged and non-judged classes. Also on display were some amazing thread painting art with hopes that a thread painting entry class will be added for 2025. WSQG contributes monies and memberships to 12 awards.

The 2025 Opportunity Quilt was on display with tickets sold to many individuals. I sold some to people from New York and Florida!

Every year there is a "themed" quilt entry. For 2025 the theme is "Wyoming Wildflowers" so let your imaginations run wild and start planning your entry!

On another note, there is still Quilt Camp funding available. See Chris Wolf's students and their wonderful quilting talents and contributions elsewhere in this newsletter.



2024 Opportunity Quilt

WHEATLAND – Wyoming State Quilt Guild donated two books to the Platte County Library featuring quilting. The funds to purchase the books came from year-long "opportunity quilt" [ticket sales] in which a quilt is displayed across the state and ... tickets are sold for the opportunity to win. This year, Wheatland crafter Candy Anderson held the winning ticket. She was able to take home the quilt made by master quilter Di Wilsey Geer from Cheyenne, called "A tisket, A Tasket, What's in Your Basket."

"Of course, it's a beautiful quilt – who wouldn't want the masterpiece of a quilt? It's a piece of art!" Anderson said. "Any time you enter [purchase a ticket], though, it's not because you expect to win: it's to benefit the cause, and what a cause it is to help the literacy program within the whole state of Wyoming."

Anderson wanted to highlight the generosity of quilters. "Their purpose in life is to bless somebody with a quilt, whether as a gift or fundraisers, etc. This literacy fundraiser is a perfect example of the powerful things quilters can accomplish," she said.

The [opportunity quilt] raised \$3,500, less costs of material for the quilt, to buy an instructional quilt book and a children's storybook featuring quilts for the libraries.

The announcement was made at the annual retreat in Cheyenne, which was partly organized by Linda Shelton of Wheatland. The retreat hosted over 250 quilters from around the state who collaborated and participated in classes by nationally known quilting teachers. Classes were geared for a variety of quilters, from beginners on up.

"It's a great organization to belong to. Wyoming quilt stores and individual quilters across the state have at least one weekend retreat each year. It's a great opportunity to share ideas and talents," Shelton said.

FEATURED QUILTER JANET MAINES

My Quilting Story Janet Maines

I didn't grow up quilting at my grandmother's knee, like most of you. The quilter in my family was my Great-Aunt Edie, who died before I was born. I have her blue and white Drunkard's Path quilt, dated May 1894. My mother sewed most of my clothes, and I spent many hours watching her lay out dress patterns on our kitchen table. I started sewing my daughter's little corduroy bib overalls, then school dresses on my mother's old Necchi.

In the late 90's, I took a quilt class at Casper College, taught by Yung Hi Torski, and I was hooked from the first class. My first quilt was a chimneys and cornerstones, using blues with red cornerstones. I asked my friend Barbara Davis to take the next class with me, and we've been quilting ever since. Since we worked together, we would visit a couple quilt shops in the Douglas area on our lunch hour. We started attending the Prairie Stitcher Thimbleberries Club, and began making block-of-the-month quilts offered by the quilt shop. I enjoyed making mystery quilts at the Prairie Stitcher.

I made the Bears in the Woods quilt by Eleanor Burns, that started my tradition of giving graduation, then wedding, then baby quilts for my grandchildren and grandnieces and grandnephews (and now great-grands).



Dear Jane Block of the Month 2016

I enjoy the piecing the best, and I am not at all original in my quilting, but I can follow a pattern. I finish my quilts with stitching in the ditch, and I sew my bindings by hand. I think my biggest accomplishment was the Dear Jane BOM project. It was shown at the HMQS in Salt Lake City, in a year that wasn't juried. I encourage everyone to enter their local and state fairs. My first bargello entry received a 3rd place at the state fair, and I felt so flattered. I have received many red, white, and blue ribbons from my various entries, and have received a couple Judges Choice awards. I received a Best-of-Show ribbon for my entry in the reclaimed category, with a Rail Fence quilt made from my brother-in-law's neckties.

With three friends, I have attended the Houston International quilt show; the Road to California; and the great bus trip to Paducah organized by Jennifer Golden. When you go with friends and divide the room by four, it is affordable.

A highlight for me was to have a bed turning, held in my bedroom. After I retired, I started attending a quilt/craft group on Tuesday mornings at our local rec... center. I figured it would be easier to invite the ladies to my house instead of taking all my quilts to the rec. center. I invited them to arrive around 9:30am for coffee cake, then adjourned to my bedroom where I had my quilts stacked up on my bed. The "show" lasted an hour, then we had chicken-salad sandwiches on croissants for lunch. The last friend left around 3:00 pm. It was great to host my friends.

Barbara Davis and I joined WSQG in 2001 and started going to Quilt Wyoming in 2001 in Powell. We have attended every year since. I can't say enough about attending the educational and FUN classes offered by WSQG. I have learned so much. The best is the friends we gain along the years, and to be among the great quilters in Wyoming.







2024 Summer Quilt Camp, Cody, Wyoming

A quilt camp took place in Cody, Wyoming for six weeks this summer. The camp was run a bit differently because of the uniqueness of our community in the summer due to the significant tourist flow into our city. Many of our participants have multiple commitments in the summer due to sports camps, swim lessons and family. Transportation plays a significant part in when they can attend. Our participants come on the days that they can, during the six weeks. The majority of our quilters attended over 70% of the available hours.

The quilt camp ran for what we termed two sessions. The first session was June 11th through the 27th on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings from 9:00-11:30 am each day. We again repeated the same format in our second session which was from July 9th through July 25th. The camp offered 45 possible hours of creating quilts. There were ten quilters who attended during these sessions. They were assisted by six volunteers!

We chose not to make kits. All material, batting, and thread was donated by the generous quilting community from our area. The first day was a lesson in choosing patterns and shopping in our

multiple closets for material. The students picked material for three quilts that will be donated to the local hospice house. The first quilt called "Night Sky," was our teaching quilt which involved learning to iron, cut, sew quarter-inch seams, the half-square

triangle process and layout of a quilt. The process of measuring and cutting borders and making binding was also part of the process.

Our second and third quilts were panel quilts. The quilters learned to make flying geese units, friendship stars, piano key borders and even sewing a "Y" seam. They also continued working on their skills for borders and binding. Several of our young quilters ventured into personal projects. They added making four- and nine-patch blocks and learning that organization is critical when starting to join blocks into rows, and rows into the quilt as a whole.

Survey Results

A short, informal survey was made available for member input from August 30-September 7. 237 members responded.

1. Quilt Wyoming Duration: Covid caused us to combine QW 2020 and 2021. We held this QW Wednesday-Sunday. We have continued this schedule through 2025.

Wednesday-Sunday

30% Disagree 20% Prefer 49% Neutral

Thursday-Sunday

11% Disagree 55% Prefer 34% Neutral

Conclusion: 35% more prefer to return to the 2-day class schedule, Thursday-Sunday. Members expressed factors such as expense and fatigue. The duration will remain the choice of the QW committee. This feedback helps the committee make this decision. If the longer schedule is offered, members have the option of attending fewer days, arriving a day later or leaving a day early.

2. Quilt Wyoming Brochure: Members were asked if a printed or online Quilt Wyoming brochure is preferred.

Continue Mailed & Online QW Brochure 33% Disagree 43% Prefer 24% Neutral

Online Only

29% Disagree 53% Prefer 18% Neutral

Conclusion: 10% more prefer online only for the brochure. A significant number continue to favor a mailed brochure. We will make it an option on the membership form to continue to receive the brochure by mail, as we do with Patchwords. Each brochure costs a little more than \$4.00 each to print and mail at this time. Cost is a consideration but should not prevent us from providing copies in color to those who feel this is important to them.

3. Quilt Wyoming Registration: Members were asked for opinions on registering online for Quilt Wyoming.

Continue to Register by Mail Only 48% Disagree 18% Prefer 35% Neutral

Register Online or by Mail

10% Disagree 76% Prefer 13% Neutral

Conclusion: 58% more prefer online and mailed registration. A Board committee has been appointed to review the pros and cons and procedures for online registration. Mailed registration would be placed in a queue based on postmark with online registration by entry date. This would be equitable. The service charge for using a credit card would be passed through to members.
