



# Stitch by Stitch SUPPLY LIST

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Machine sew tiny blocks stitch-by-stitch while creating a precious quilt. Lots of machine skills are covered such as stitching with heavy thread, couching ribbon with thin thread, applique with thin thread, and embellished prairie points. Work from a kit to avoid the drudgery of finding supplies. This class is best suited for patient quilters who are thrilled with details! 10" quilt, 2" blocks on point

## Required KIT contains:

Optional color choices may be available.

Check with class organizer for price.

- background fabric & practice: 7.5" x 11"
- stabilizer & practice: 7.5" x 11"
- border fabric: 11" square
- prairie point fabric: 2.25" x >9" strip
- binding fabric: 1.375" x 50" (to finish later - not covered in class)
- batting: 12" square
- backing: 12" square
- thread for blocks & pps: 1 Spagetti 12wt
- thread for embellishing: 1 Spagetti 12wt
- thread for couching sashing: 1 Invisafil 100wt
- thread for applique border: 1 Invisafil 100wt
- thread for bobbin: 1 cotton bobbin 50-60wt
- felted wool balls: (2) 1cm (halved)
- 4mm buttons: (4)
- braided ribbon: at least 53"
- freezer paper: block layout template, border applique template
- instruction booklet
- zippered bag & zip bag for tiny pieces

## Optional items available for purchase in class:

- needle: 60/8 or 70/10 microtex for thin threads
- needle: 90/14 topstitch for heavy threads
- needle: Tulip embroidery #7 for hand embellishing



Stitch by Stitch, 10" square, 2" blocks

- Acorn Seam-Align glue
- Acorn Easy Press fabric pen
- Prairie Pointer Tool

## Students need to bring:

- small rotary cutting mat (9" or bigger)
- ruler at least 12" in length (acrylic)
- (4) pins
- lead pencil
- white fabric pencil
- stiletto and/or seam ripper
- thread snips (optional)
- craft knife with fresh blade (Exacto knife or similar)
- sewing machine capable of zig-zag, open-toe foot, empty bobbin, machine manual *NOTE: Machines and feet might be provided if you're attending a conference. Check with organizer.*
- If not purchased in class, then the following are also needed: 60/8 or 70/10 Microtex needle, 90/14 Topstitch needle, Embroidery #7 needle (or similar), Fabric glue with fine tip

## Available for sharing:

- rotary cutter, acrylic ruler for cutting prairie points
- scissors for cutting felted wool balls
- glue stick
