I have such good news to share with all of you! We have finally been granted access to dorm rooms for QW2025. In fact, we will have a total of 164 beds which will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. So if the cost of a motel room was making you hesitate about joining us in June, that problem is solved!

The new dorms in Cheyenne where we stayed last year will be a tough act to follow. Our dorms are older and the rooms are not air-conditioned, but they are clean and affordable, and make it much more convenient for quilters to not have to travel to off-site housing. And there is something really special about coming to WWCC on June 25th and not leaving the campus until June 29th. Quilters use their free time on campus to congregate and catch up with each other and it fosters a real sense of camaraderie, which is one of the most special aspects of Quilt Wyoming.

These will include contact information for regional instructors who are willing to communicate with quilters who might have questions about their classes. We encourage you to reach out to those instructors and get your questions answered so you can make the best decisions about your class choices.

These Facebook postings will begin after the brochure is mailed and posted on the WSQG website.

I hope that many of you will be submitting quilts for display at Quilt Wyoming. It is amazing to see the talent reflected in the quilt entries. Finally, we look forward to seeing the Challenge Quilt entries. This is one of the best parts of Quilt Wyoming. It

is really fun and inspiring to see how different quilters start with the same challenge fabrics and come up with such different and creative entries. June 15th is the deadline for submitting the entry forms.

We are excited to pilot online registration for Quilt Wyoming 2025 and hope that it will streamline registration and benefit all WSQG members. 

Contact Nena James, President-Elect, if you are willing to run for any of these positions. There is also a link on the WSQG website (Officers & History tab) to submit your nominations.


Please consider volunteering to serve the WSQG by running for these positions. Your input is so valuable to the WSQG and its future depends on your participation.

Featured Quilter Audrey Jarvis

I was born in Wheatland and raised in Chugwater, WY. I began attending the University of Wyoming in fall of 1966. I taught home economics in Upton for a couple years when my kids were little. I have lived in Casper ever since. I have been blessed to be a snow bird in Yuma, Arizona, for the past 14 years.

I've been active in several quilting groups through the years. Currently I attend two in

Yuma, AZ, and Binding Friends in Casper.

I enjoyed attending Quilting in the Tetons when it was active and I still enjoy going to Mallo Camp in the Black Hills. I attend the "Wheatwater" retreat every November in Wheatland.

I raised my two kids as a single parent. When they were both off to college I needed something to do as an empty nester. I had been interested in learning to quilt. I wanted to carry on the tradition of both of my grandmothers and my mother although my quilts are not hand quilted as theirs were. I caught the fever in the early 90's and still have it, and the fabric "collection" to go along with it. (Isn't that what the symptoms are?) It's a family thing again now as my niece and daughter are into quilting too. Sharing valuable time quilting together makes my heart happy.

My favorite thing is choosing and working with color. I have always considered myself a traditional quilter but now I find making art quilts challenging.

I also enjoy going to quilt shows and retreats with quilting family and friends. I just got back from Road to California and QuiltCon in Phoenix with my daughter, Heather Jarvis and my niece, Laura Costy, both WSQG members.

My first project was a table runner and place mats. My quilting mentor at the time suggested a small project to start with and I totally agree with her suggestion. I tell prospective new quilters the same thing. It's important to get satisfaction from completing a smaller project than attempting a large project and never seeing it finished.

I have been awarded numerous ribbons at county fair, state fair and Desert Lily quilt show in Yuma, Arizona. I've received people's choice twice at Wyoming State Fair, and to me that means more than a blue ribbon.

Carolyn Dalby and Jan DeBolt were my mentors in the beginning. Laura Costy, Virginia Ohr, and Carol Kolf have inspired me locally. Jinny Beyer, Eleanor Burns and Vi Colombe were inspirational to me early on, and more recently Kaffe Fassett, Ricky Tims, Phil Beaver, and Laura Heine.

I love any quilting gadget! Its really exciting to see what changes have come about in the time I've been quilting. Better mats, non-slip rulers, different rotary cutter designs and better blades, etc, etc. One of my favorite notions are serrated scissors for cutting fabric

for collage quilts.

Some of my favorite magazines were "Quilt Mania" and "Simply Modern Quilts." I am sorry that they are no longer published. I now enjoy "Quiltfolk" and "Quilting Arts".

Kaffe Fassett fabrics are my favorite, anything with lots of color!

My advice to newer quilters is to buy the best fabric you can afford. Why spend hours and hours working with cheap fabric that doesn't stand up? Take classes. There is so much to learn in the world of quilting. If you are a new quilter and want to learn, you will learn something new with each class that you take, probably several things. Always put a label on your quilt.

I joined WSQG as a charter member, as soon as it was born 28 years ago. I have served as Central Regional Director and I am also a past President of WSQG.

The friendships I've made through the years in WSQG mean the most to me. I love seeing old friends and meeting new ones and seeing what projects everyone is working on.

I always look forward to learning new techniques at Quilt Wyoming classes. I'm looking forward to attending Quilt Wyoming in Rock Springs this summer.



Attention! Anyone interested in funds to plan and coordinate a Quilt Camp:

The purpose of the Wyoming State Quilt Guild is to unite those who love the quilter's art, to preserve the heritage of quilting, and to be a source of education.

As one of the outreach programs, WSQG offers funding to a member or members to plan and coordinate a "Quilt Camp." Quilt Camp is a planned event for beginning quilters and can be organized by individuals, or through 4-H, schools, Boys and Girls Clubs, etc.

After viewing the 4-H quilting and sewing projects at the Wyoming State Fair last August, I thought there might be some sewing/quilting 4-H leaders interested in WSQG Quilt Camp funding. Here are some of the details:

- The organizer must be a WSQG member to apply for the funding. Membership at \$20 year is open to all who love the quilter's art. The applications for membership (Membership tab) and camp funding (Quilt Camp tab) are online at www.wsqg.org.
- Once submitted, the Quilt Camp application goes to the WSQG Director at Large for preapproval. Following pre-approval, the application is presented to the WSQG Board.
- Funds are to be spent on supplies used for quilting and are capped at \$50 per student with a maximum of 10 students, thus not to exceed \$500.
- After the camp is completed, receipts and the reimbursement form is sent in to the Director at Large for reimbursement from the WSQG Treasurer.
- Quilt Camp coordinators are asked to provide pictures to WSQG with permission to put them in the WSQG newsletter and/or a poster displayed at Quilt Wyoming so members can enjoy seeing the fun and creativity made possible by this funding!

Funding is available on a first come, first served basis.






