Welcome to Quilt Wyoming 2025, which will be held at Western Wyoming Community College (WWCC)) June 25-29, 2025. Check-in will be held in front of Rushmore Gymnasium between 3:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 25, 2025. Those arriving later may check in and pick up registration information and welcoming materials at the registration desk from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, Friday or Saturday.

Please use the southern entrance clearly marked as Door 6. Please refer to the campus diagram shown on page 15 of this brochure, which shows the entrance and available parking.

Quilt Wyoming Registration: We are excited to offer both online and mail-in registration beginning on April 15, 2025. All registrations will be processed on a first come, first served basis, with priority given to WSQG members. Registration envelopes should not be postmarked prior to April 15, 2025, and envelopes postmarked prior to that date will be opened after May 1, 2025. Registration for classes between April 15, 2025, and May 1, 2025, is reserved for WSQG members only. If you are not a member of WSQG or if your registration form is postmarked earlier than April 15, 2025, you will not be registered for classes until after May 1, 2025. Class fees are listed in two amounts: WSQG members/non-members. When registering, pay the fee for your first-choice class:

You do not need to wait to mail your membership application, but your Quilt Wyoming 2025 class registration must be dated April 15, 2025, or later.

Important Dates

- **April 15** Online and mail-in registration begins for Quilt Wyoming 2025 (If postmarked before April 15, 2025, they will not be opened until May 1, 2025)
- June 1 Last day that written cancellations will be accepted and refunds made
- June 1 Last day to order and pay for souvenir shirts
- June 15 Last day to register for meals and pay meal fees
- June 15 Entry forms due for challenge quilts
- June 15 Entry forms due for quilt show
- June 25-29 Quilt Wyoming 2025

Housing: The cost for housing in the dormitories is \$90 per person/double occupancy and \$160 per person/single occupancy for four nights. The dorms are not air-conditioned but have elevators. There are a limited number of rooms (164 beds total) which will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. No more than four people share a bathroom. No linens or towels are provided. Also included in this brochure on page 15 is a list of nearby local hotels which have offered reduced rates to Quilt Wyoming participants.

- **Meals:** All meals will be served at WWCC. The cost of the Wednesday night meal is \$16.00. The three-meal plan for Thursday, Friday and Saturday is \$30.00 per day. Breakfast on Sunday (WSQG members only) is \$12.00. Please note that individual meals cannot be purchased at the door.
- Alcohol and Smoking Policy: There is no alcohol served or permitted on campus at any time. Please respect the policy of the college in this regard. All buildings on campus are smoke-free. In addition, please respect the comfort of other participants who may be allergic to perfume.
- **Class Locations:** All classes will be held on the WWCC campus. Room assignments for specific classes will be provided at check-in. Classrooms are air-conditioned.
- **Meet and Greet, Opening of Vendor Mall and Quilt Show.** Join us for the opening of the vendor mall and quilt show and the Meet and Greet of the Quilt Wyoming 2025 instructors at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday night at the Rushmore Gymnasium at WWCC.
- **Vendor Mall and Quilt Show:** The vendor mall and quilt show will be open Wednesday evening from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m., Thursday and Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Be sure to visit the vendors often!



Quilt Display: Start considering which quilts you will put in the Quilt Wyoming 2025 guilt display. Please submit quilts that have not been shown previously at Quilt Wyoming. Unfinished guilts will not be accepted. The maximum number of quilts that can be entered is three (3) per member. Send an entry form for each quilt to Iris Jasperson, 448 Bowles Lane, Afton, WY 83119. The form is in this brochure and on the website at www.wsqg.org. Quilts must have a quilt sleeve for hanging. Please pick up your quilt on Saturday afternoon between 5:00 and 5:30 p.m. or Saturday evening after the evening program. If you are unable to pick up your quilt, please include return postage or the name of the person authorized to pick up your guilt. Winners will be announced at the evening program on Saturday night.

Challenge Quilts: Your challenge quilt registration form must be received by June 15, 2025. Bring your challenge quilt to the registration desk on Wednesday, June 25, 2025, or mail it to Becky Drnas, 1016 Laramie Street, Rock Springs, WY 82901. Please pick up your quilt on Saturday afternoon between 5:00 and 5:30 p.m. or Saturday evening after the evening program. If you are unable to pick up your quilt, please include return postage or the name of the person authorized to pick up your quilt. Winners will be announced at the evening program on Saturday night. If you have any questions, please contact Becky Drnas at 307-389-3612. The entry form is also available at www.wsqg.org.

Opportunity Quilt: Ticket money and stubs can be handed in during check-in. Please return any tickets you have not sold. Tickets will be available for sale throughout the event. The drawing will be Sunday morning. The winner need not be present.

Souvenir Shirts and Pins: Be sure to order your shirts with your registration, as they will not be available for purchase at the event. Orders for shirts must be received by June 1, 2025 to be processed. Pins are included in registration. Any extra pins will be available for purchase at the check-in area.

Friendship Block: Follow the instructions on the friendship block pattern found in this brochure and on the website (www.wsqg.org) and bring your finished, signed block(s) to the registration desk on Wednesday, June 25, 2025, or Thursday, June 26, 2025. 1. Karen K. Stone - English Paper Piecing by Machine I Skill Level: Confdient Beginner



Do you love but avoid the traditional one-patch? Handwork is wonderful, but let's explore an innovative machine technique, useful for any pattern that would be English paper pieced, without compromising the integrity of the original. We begin with hexagons, then move quickly to a sunburst star (like in the pictured quilt, simplified for class). You'll enjoy having this in your bag of tricks! Sewing machine not needed. Supply Fee \$10.00

2. Susan Cleveland - Piping Hot Binding Skill Level: Confident Beginner



Piped bindings add spark and a professional finish to any style piece. Every detail of binding and tiny perfect piping will be covered in class with step-by-step demos and printed instructions. Machine differences will be addressed so students will be

successful with their own machines. Students work on their practice piece to achieve making perfect piping,preparing the quilt,applying piping,applying binding,mitering corners,joining tails,and finishing for a show-quality back. Variations will be on display and discussed. Many major award-winners are using this technique to achieve stunning results!

3. Jane Haworth - Hens and Roosters Skill Level: All



Choose from a selection of my patterns and begin work on your collaged bird. Learn my free-form and relaxing technique of tracing, cutting and gluing your fabrics onto your pattern. The finished size of this project is about 18". Also learn a variety of ideas for the background treatment and also how to free-motion quilt on the design.

4. Kaye Evans - Wyoming Clamshells Skill Level: Confident Beginner



You will learn to cut your fabrics using a 12" clam shell ruler. After cutting the clammies you will learn to sew them together. You will be amazed at how accurately they assemble. You will be given ideas for expanding on the basic clamshell. This is a very versatile technique with many creative possibilities.

5. Ruth Davis - Color Kaleidoscope Skill Level: Confident Beginner



Join Ruth Davis for a fun-filled day creating these beautiful Kaleidoscope blocks using eight repeats of a large scale print! Pick your fabrics in your favorite colors. You can also use eight panels if you'd prefer. Either way they will be gorgeous!!! **Class Handout: \$5.00**

7. Deb Kipp - Scrappy Starburst Topper Skill Level: Confident Beginner




The Christmas Cactus table topper or Scrappy Starburst table topper, depending on fabric choices. Would work great for a stash buster topper.

8. Josephine Keasler - - THREE DAY **Skill Level: Confident Beginner**



This is one of Jacqueline de Jonge's latest creations a 66" x 21" table runner featuring dragonflies. The foundation for this project is made with paper piecing and standard machine sewing. The dragonflies

are appliquéd either by hand or machine. Josephine will give you tips for all the techniques and you will leave class with a beautiful runner for your table. You can pick your own fabric or purchase a kit from Josephine.

9. Donna Toly - Shades of One-Color Potato Chip Quilt Skill Level: Beginner



What is a potato chip quilt? It is a quilt made from a pattern of blocks that use rectangles that are twice as long as they are wide. It is said to have gotten its name because, like potato chips, "they are so fun to make that you won't want to stop at just one". And Donna Toly should know because so far she has made 48 of them! It is an

excellent scrap-buster quilt for the beginner quilter. When you take this class you will learn how to make a Shades of One-Color Potato Chip Quilt, but you will also leave with a booklet compiled by Donna containing at least eight variations on the basic pattern. This is a quilt that can become addictive for quilters who love to work with color and scraps.

10. Marla Marx - Truvy Bag **Skill Level: Confident Beginner**



The Truvy bag is the perfect bag to take handwork or other small projects in when you are on the go. The bag has four zippered vinul pockets, two of which are removable by

snapping those sections out. The bag measures $7" \times 11"$ excluding handles. The removable pockets both measure 5" x 8". Pattern required.

11. Marianne Ballash - Mountain Lodge Quilt **Skill Level: Confident Beginner**



Simplify your piecing while increasing precision and accuracy. Come try out some new tools and practice cutting and pressing techniques for more perfect patchwork. Make a couple of quilt blocks or finish a complete quilt. QuiltingWithMarianne.com.

If every straight line is identical, every free curve might be considered unique. What curves do you naturally cut? Let's explore that, and learn to piece them beautifully so your work will press perfectly flat.

14. Susan Cleveland - Stitch by Stitch **Skill Level: Confident Beginner**




Machine sew tiny blocks stitch-by-stitch while creating a precious quilt. Lots of machine skills are covered such as stitching with heavy thread, couching ribbon with thin thread, applique with thin thread, and embellished prairie points. Work from a kit to avoid the drudgery of finding supplies. This class is best suited for

patient guilters who are thrilled with details! 10" guilt, 2" blocks on point. Kit: Required \$55.00. The kit includes everything on the supply list.

15. Jane Haworth - Pets Fabric Collage - TWO DAY Skill Level: All



In this 2-day class students will learn to enlarge a photo of a pet to about a 20" size design. Using a variety of fabrics we will trace and fussy cut these fabrics and apply in my raw edge fabric collage technique. I will give guidance on stitching and finishing the quilt. A close up of your pets face probably works

best. I will give guidance on making the enlargement approximately 200% before the class which will be used as the pattern.

16. Iris Jasperson - Jelly Roll Sizzle Skill Level: Beginner



Put a little "sizzle" in your quilting life by creating the Jelly Roll sizzle! This free pattern from the Fat Quarter Shop is a fun and easy way to do that! The pattern comes in four different sizes. For our class we will be making the lap size.

19. Lauren Andrist - Wind Drifter Skill Level: Confident Beginner



Wind Drifter is a fat eights or a fat quarter friendly pattern, using half square triangles and rectangles to form an eye-catching pinwheel. Wind Drifter goes together very quickly, and you can make either a 65" x 65" throw or a 32-¼ " x 32-¼" wall hanging or table topper. Both sizes use the same number of half square triangles and rectangles, and can very easily be completed in a day.

20. Marla Marx - Illusionary Bars Skill Level: All



This class is a technique class providing the opportunity to create an optical illusion art quilt with fabric. Embellishments will be added to create a oneof-a-kind completed project. Kits will be provided in class and will include fabric, batting, backing, binding, beading needles, thread and beads. **Kit \$10**



points with the Prairie Pointer Tool and use tricky piecing to assemble the arcs, circle and background. Points are threedimensional and design possibilities are endless. Finished quilt is 27"x 24"

25. Kaye Evans - Feathered Star Skill Level: Confident Beginner



Use the center to showcase a big print fabric or panel. This is a stunner! This beautiful 38" star can be made with a pieced center or some wonderful, luscious fabric cut to size like Kaye did in the class sample. This quilt requires precision piecing so it is not a beginner project, but is for a more accurate piecer with sewing experience.



Quilt Wyoming 2025 Friendship Block Modified Mexican Star

Basic paper piecing skills are required to make four (4) blocks. Use a 1/4" seam allowance.

Fabric Requirements:

Background - cut (4) 4-1/2" squares

Center Block - cut (1) 4-1/2" square out of print fabric

Paper Pieced Blocks:

#1 cut (4) 2-1/2" x 5" rectangles

#2 & #3 cut (8) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles from background fabric

#4 & 5 cut (4) 3" squares and cut in half diagonally


Construct Block:

1. Center (1) - Sew a paper pieced block to top and bottom of center block. This section will measure $4-1/2^{"} \times 12-1/2^{"}$.

2. Sides (2) - Sew one 4-1/2" background block to top and bottom of a paper pieced block. These sections will measure 4-1/2" x 12-1/2".

3. Sew side strips to center strip. Unfinished block should measure 12-1/2".


Be sure your printer is not set to scale at anything other than 100%.
