President's Corner

Hello everyone!

I am honored to serve as President of the Wyoming State Quilt Guild and look forward to serving with the Board of Directors for the coming year. The WSQG is more than a wonderful organization that provides its members with so many benefits. It is a community in and of itself and that is perhaps the most important role that it plays in my life.

This idea of "community" was reinforced as I read over the Quilt Wyoming Evaluations which quilters filled out in Rock Springs at the end of Quilt Wyoming 2025. When answering the question about why they participated in Quilt Wyoming, quilters wrote about taking classes from great instructors, learning new techniques and getting inspiration for their future projects. However, the most common theme was connecting with friends and making new ones.

One quilter wrote: "Love the mingling of all the great women of all ages. It's all so mind blowing with the opportunities." Another wrote that she loves "sewing with others with my same passion – friendships develop." And another – "My 1<sup>st</sup> time. I was excited for the classes, vendors and friendships."

Another thing that resonated with me was seeing so many mother/daughter attendees. What a great thing for mothers and daughters to share – learning together and creating not only quilts and new friendships, but also very special memories. I confess to feeling a bit jealous because although I have three daughters, none of them are quilters yet.

I don't have a real agenda for the coming year in terms of leading this organization. I have been off the Board for three years and have been so involved with organizing Quilt Wyoming 2025 that I am really not aware of the issues that all of you think need addressing. I do know that there are concerns about the Standing Rules regarding regional events. Although the committee reviewing the By-Laws and Standing Rules worked on this issue, it became apparent that more information needed to be gathered to address it properly and so no changes were made at this year's annual meeting.

The regional event rules need improvement and we will work on that in the coming year. It is critical that the nonprofit status of the WSQG be protected. It is also important to recognize the differences between various regions and the challenges and realities they face as they put on regional events. Please contact me about your concerns because it is important that every WSQG member's voice be heard.

There will be other issues that require the Board's attention. Please help me by letting me know what those issues are so they can be addressed.

Quilt Wyoming 2025 was a lot of fun and I thank the committee that hosted it and everyone who attended. The QW2026 committee has put together a great event for next year. We can all look forward to great classes, lots of inspiration and an opportunity to be a part of the community that is the Wyoming State Quilt Guild.

Paintbrush Piecers members in Cody, continue to work on the guild's 2025 challenge - to finish their UFOs, especially older ones. Members who aren't specifically participating in the challenge have also been inspired to finish UFOs. It is so much fun to see these projects being completed! The guild donated a roll of quilt batting to the Cody Middle School Quilting Enrichment Class which made quilts for veterans. registered through Quilts of Valor. Several PPQG members teach or are volunteers to help these students make and present eight quilts to veterans. This occurred at the end of May. This class continues during the summer as a quilt camp, bolstered by a grant from WSQG.

In May, the guild program was making button art. Members brought many buttons!
