WSF dates are August 12-16 with entries accepted online, by mail, or in-person drop off Friday, August 8th and Saturday, 9th 10:00 am-6:00 pm; and, open judging Sunday, August 10th starting at 8:00 am. For those of you not familiar with open

judging, you are able to be present and listen while the judge places the quilts in each class according to the criteria the quilts are judged on. When entries are picked up you receive a sheet with a review of the entry."

WSQG supports the WSF by awarding cash prizes and ribbons in 12 categories and includes a one-year membership to WSQG for each winner. Two awards are in the youth division. I'm looking forward to seeing some youth entries this year as I'm super excited that WSQG has allocated funds for five quilt camps!

New Needlework classes this year include:

Heirloom Quilt - Showcase a quilt with a story! While the quilt does not need to be made by the exhibitor, you must

include who quilted it, when, and how it came into your possession. Only quilts with known provenance will be accepted.

Wyoming Wildflowers - Stitch together a tribute to the beauty of Wyoming's native blooms in quilted form

Regional Co-Directors - Northwest Region



Roberta Oliver

Roberta Oliver's love and passion for quilting started over 30 years ago. She had learned to sew clothing at age 13 on her aunt's treadle sewing machine, but after moving to Tucson, AZ in 1993, quilting became an interest, then passion. Her first quilt was from a pattern in Quiltmaker magazine and yes, she still has that quilt.

Roberta eventually discovered a new quilt shop in town, the Tucson Quilters Guild and their annual quilt show every January. She took classes at the quilt shop and then from nationally known teachers that the Tucson Quilters Guild brought to Tucson. She learned many new skills and gained confidence in her quilting through these classes and teachers. During this time, Bonnie Hunter was one of the teachers she took a couple of classes from. She continued to take classes from her whenever she came to AZ. During one of Bonnie's mystery quilts that she does each December, a group of Bonnie fans formed a group that met every other month to spend a Saturday sewing. Roberta helped with facilitating a place for them to sew. They called themselves "The Bonnie Bee." They were able to meet up until COVID. During COVID (2021).

Roberta retired from her job of 42 years – teaching special education. During those 42 years she was involved in a number of professional organizations related to special education, including Council for Exceptional Children (CEC). With retirement, she and her husband were able to finally make the move from AZ to WY, after 28 years of planning.

They bought their home in Meeteetse four years ago and two weeks after the final trip of the move, she was at Quilt Wyoming in Powell. She has become active in the Paintbrush Piecers Quilt Guild in Cody and Chatelaine Quilt Guild in Meeteetse, with this year taking the reins of facilitating the Meeteetse group.

She is currently on the planning committee for Quilt Wyoming 2026 in Powell, serving as the chair for the committee selecting the national teachers. She feels very passionate about guilds and quilting groups, not only for what she has learned there, but also for the social contacts that we all continue to establish with one another. Roberta feels that guilds are where we share our knowledge of our craft with new quilters ("We were all there once".). Roberta says we support each other, as we learn and perfect our skills as quilters and support each other through life's challenges.

If elected, she looks forward to the opportunity to serve on the board of the Wyoming State Quilt Guild and getting to know more of you as she serves as a Regional Co-Director of the Northwest Region.



Cyndy Jahn-Thomas

Cyndy Jahn-Thomas lives in the rural Powell area. She cannot remember not being a sewist! She was hooked on working with fabric since learning to sew when eight years old. Making school clothes, her prom dresses and tailored jackets were one of her favorite things to do as she was growing up on a Wisconsin dairy farm.

Her sewing journey began to include quilting when she took her first hand-piecing, hand-quilting class in

Red Lodge MT, in the early 1980s. Quilt fabric was calico, very limited, and torn, or cut using templates and scissors! Since then, She has continually expanded her quilting skills and enjoys anything using a sewing machine, even beading by machine. More recent projects have also included making vessels, handapplique, hand-stitching, felting and wool applique. Her favorite parts of quilting are choosing fabrics, designing, and making the tops. She machine quilts most of her own quilts using my older Pfaffs or a mid-arm quilter.

She moved to Wyoming in 1991. She joined the Chatelaine Quilt Guild in Meeteetse and soon became their coordinator for about five years. She designed a guild mystery quilt, and taught basic quilting classes. Another move found Cyndy working at Big Horn Quilts in Greybull for four years where she learned a lot from her coworkers and customers, especially about color choice. What a fun job!

She worked the night shift for years as an ICU and ER RN, which left her little opportunity to go to guild meetings but she took classes at Quilt Colorado, Quilting in the Tetons, and a few at Quilt Wyoming when it was in Powell. Last year was her first year at an entire Quilt Wyoming! She says she has been a hit-and-miss member of WSQG. She is serving on the Quilt Wyoming 2026 committee.

Cyndy became actively involved with the Paintbrush Piecers Quilt Guild and Textile Artists of Greater Yellowstone (TAGY) in Cody several years ago. This is the second year she has been the president/coordinator of the quilt guild. She is now earnestly working on finishing some of the numerous UFOs that have piled up over the years (also her challenge to the guild members!), as well as making new quilts and other fiber items for herself, for gifts, and as service projects.

Cyndy is married, has three grown children, two spoiled golden retrievers. Her other interests are exploring the mountains and backroads of WY and MT, travel, photography, cooking, gardening and yard work, and reading. She is an advocate of and practices life-long learning.

She is interested in serving as the Northwest Region co-director with Roberta Oliver, to continue to share her love of quilting and promote our craft and artistry to others. If elected, she hopes her varied experiences can help her to become a contributing member of the Wyoming State Quilt Guild Guild.





ByLaws - Proposed Amendments June 29, 2025

Page 1 --

Section 1.3 OFFICES; REGISTERED AGENTS: **ADD: The Treasurer will be the registered agent.**

Page 2-3 -

Section 4.11 ADD: BOARD OF DIRECTORS COMPENSATION DELETE: OF DIRECTORS; REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES: ADD: Members of the Board shall not ADD: receive pay or compensation ADD: from WSQG for services rendered DELETE: to the Board of Directors. Board Members DELETE: Directors will be reimbursed for mileage to attend ADD: the November face-to-face meeting. DELETE: one meeting of the Board of Directors.

ADD: If Board Members require an overnight stay to attend the November face-to-face meeting, the costs for a hotel room may be reimbursed at a maximum of \$200 per night per person and dinner at a maximum of \$40 per person. Reimbursement will be made with the presentation of invoices and an Expense Request Form. The requirement would include distance from home to Casper over 150 miles or in the event of inclement weather. The budget includes \$300 each for the President and the President-Elect to be used for promoting membership and Board recruitment. The budget includes \$300 each of the the five Regional Directors to attend guild meetings throughout their regions, travel to plan regional events and office supply expenses to reach out to their regions. If supplies like irons, ironing boards and extension cords are purchased with these funds, those items remain WSQG property and should be included on the region's inventory. The budget includes \$300 for use by the Director at Large for travel to the State Fair and to provide ribbons for winners at the State Fair, as well as expenses related to quilt camps. Board Members are not to be reimbursed to attend Quilt Wyoming or Regional Events they would otherwise attend.

Page 3

ADD: Section 4.13 PROPERTY INVENTORY: All Board Members must email an inventory of WSQG property undertheir charge and said location of those properties to the WSGQ Board before May 1 each year. The Secretary will compile those emails into one property/location document by board position and include it in the minutes for the May Board meeting annually.

Section 5.2 TERM OF OFFICE: ... The term of Director at Large shall be two (2) years, **ADD: elected on even years.**

... ADD: a replacement cannot be found for an open position the board may appoint a member to fill the position or order a special election. Delete: Regional Directors are unable to find a replacement to run for office, an additional two-year term may be served.

Page 4 --

- D. TREASURER: ADD: The Treasurer shall act as the registered agent. The Treasurer shall assure that a professional accountant shall complete the required IRS 990 forms to comply with 501(c) (3) requirements and deadlines.
- F. REGIONAL DIRECTORS: The quilt stand part of this sentence has been moved to bottom of this paragraph. ADD: Regional Directors must submit a regional report for Patchwords every other month, reporting on events and news in their region. They must plan or assist in planning a regional event at least once per year in their region. They must conduct regular inspection of the quilt stands, and determine which need to be repaired or discarded and report current inventory including any changes and document them DELETE: In their Regional Director notebooks.

Page 5 --ARTICLE IV

Section 6.3 COMMITTEE ADD: REPORTS DELETE: RECORDS: ...

DELETE: An annual written report shall be provided and filed with the secretary. ADD: A report will be submitted to the board.

Standing Rules - Proposed Amendments June 29, 2025

Page 1 --I. MEMBERSHIP

- B. Membership Pin New members will receive a WSQG pin with **ADD:** their registration materials at Quilt Wyoming. If the new member does not attend Quilt Wyoming, the pin may be mailed. DELETE: with their first membership card.
- C. Membership Roster No person, directly or indirectly, may render, pay, offer, solicit or accept any money, service or other valuable considerations for or on account of any release of **ADD: names**, addresses, telephone numbers or email information of any member of this organization. **ADD: The roster cannot be distributed or shared for any other purpose without permission from WSQG.**

II. STANDING COMMITTEES

A. 3. Books for County Libraries - The Chair encourages members to submit ideas for books. **ADD: The books must be educational books to encourage interest and participation in the art of quilting.**

Page 1-8 --

- B. 4– Historian ... ADD: The scrapbook is made available for members to view at Quilt Wyoming. The Historian encourages members to submit photos, newspaper articles and other information about quilt events throughout the state.
- C. Archives Director The Archives Director collects historical data to place in the State Archives in Cheyenne, Wyoming. This data includes Board meeting minutes, Patchwords, scrapbooks, Quilt Wyoming brochures and other information to preserve the organizational history. Financial records are not accepted by the State Archives.
- D. Quilt Wyoming Quilt Wyoming will rotate through the five regions in the following order: Central, Southeast, Southwest, Northwest, Northeast. Quilt Wyoming shall not be held in the same WSQG region consecutive years. Every effort shall be made to hold it in every region over a period of ten (10) years.
- 1. Planning Committee A minimum of three years before a region's designated Quilt Wyoming, the Regional Director should call a regional meeting. The Committee shall select a Committee Chair.
- 2. Theme The theme must be selected a minimum of three years in advance. The theme and other details must be kept secret by the committee until the theme is revealed at the prior year's Quilt Wyoming. The Quilt Wyoming Committee Chair must communicate the theme to the upcoming Quilt Wyoming Chair when that Committee is formed, to avoid duplicating the theme.
- Records All records and evaluations should be maintained to pass on to the next Quilt Wyoming committee as soon as possible after Quilt Wyoming.
- 4. Date The date should be determined. The second or third week of July is recommended.
- 5. Location Each region shall decide the city in which the convention will be held. A location and facility should be discussed and a firm commitment from the facility should be initiated. Contracts for a facility should be finalized a minimum of two years before Quilt Wyoming.
- 6. Evening Presentations National Instructors are assigned a night for an evening presentation and lecture. The Committee shall decide if an additional fee is charged for the evening presentation, or if they will be free of charge. The public may be invited and may

be charged or not to attend. Announcements or awards that apply to everyone should not be made at the events where there is a charge, so that all participants have access to these announcements.

7. Quilt Wyoming Committees

- a. Committee Chair The Committee Chair schedules and facilitates committee meetings, assuring all committees are fulfilling their responsibilities. The Chair schedules meetings and distributes the meeting agendas. The Chair is the liaison for all committees and must be informed of activities of all committees. The Chair may sit on committees. The Chair signs contracts for facilities and National Instructors. The Chair participates in the WSQG Board meetings, reporting to the WSQG Board on the progress of plans for Quilt Wyoming. The Chair should write articles for Patchwords to keep membership informed and to encourage attendance.
- b. Secretary The Secretary should attend committee meetings and record minutes of the Quilt Wyoming decisions. Minutes should be distributed to all committee members in a timely manner.
- c. Treasurer The Quilt Wyoming Treasurer should be selected at the first committee meeting. Seed money of \$4,000 can be requested from the WSQG Treasurer 18 months before Quilt Wyoming. A bank account entitled WSQG, dba QW(YY), with at least two signers is opened for income deposits and payment of bills. The Quilt Wyoming Treasurer will receive all moneys and pay all bills, maintaining receipts. Sales tax must not be paid for any purchases on behalf of WSQG. The WSQG Treasurer will provide the documentation required for tax exempt purchases. The Quilt Wyoming Treasurer must keep a record of income and expenses to share with the committee and to provide a final report to the WSQG Treasurer with all income and disbursements, within 60 days after Quilt Wyoming. The original receipts (copies, if original is not available) should accompany the report and must be submitted to the WSQG Treasurer after Quilt Wyoming. Reports and all funds remaining must be transferred to the WSQG Treasurer within 60 days after Quilt Wyoming. The bank account must be closed after all Quilt Wyoming income and expenses are finalized. The Quilt Wyoming Treasurer must provide a photocopy of the check register or a typed list from the register. The Quilt Wyoming Treasurer must present proof of closure of the account with the final report to the WSQG Treasurer.
- d. Registrar The Registrar will be responsible for receiving and organizing registration applications, preparing confirmations and assuring that participants are placed in requested classes if possible. Class assignments are determined on a first come, first served basis. The Registrar maintains a spreadsheet for each participant with registration, class, lodging, meals and logo items. The Registrar works with the Quilt Wyoming Treasurer to get all registration moneys to her for deposit promptly. The Registrar requests refund checks for cancellation and overpayments from the Quilt Wyoming Treasurer and is responsible for collecting shortages for registrations. Confirmations are sent to members no later than May 15, and as needed for subsequent registration applications received. Confirmations may be sent by mail or by email. Emergency contact numbers at the event should be included. If the brochure doesn't contain a map that should be included with the confirmation. The Registrar is responsible for organizing registration check-in at the event. The Registrar may request as much help as needed. The Registrar works closely with WSQG Web Mistress for online registration and to announce class closures and cancellations. The Registrar should consult with the WSQG President to provide sets of names for drawings that may be needed (for example, the scholarships drawing).
- e. National Instructor Chair The National Instructor Chair gathers ideas from the Quilt Wyoming committee for national instructors. The Chair presents the ideas to the committee for selection. The Committee works no less than three years before the event to contact possibile instructors for biographical information, class information, supply lists and photos as well as fees. A minimum of two years before Quilt Wyoming, contracts for national

- instructors should be finalized, working with the Quilt Wyoming Treasurer to pay any deposits that the instructor requires. The Chair provides class information for the brochure to the Brochure Editor and to the Web Mistress for the website. Supply lists and digital photos are provided to the WSQG Web Mistress. A committee member serves as a liaison with the national instructors to assure that any service is needed such as help getting to their classroom, and trunk show, airport retrieval or special needs are provided in their dorm or hotel rooms. The National Instructor must be advised that the theme cannot be shared until it is revealed to WSQG members at the prior year's Quilt Wyoming.
- f. Regional Instructor Chair The Regional Instructor Chair is responsible for advertising for local instructors to submit class proposals with photos. Proposals should be collected about eight months before the event. The Regional Instructor Chair will present the proposals at a committee meeting and classes will be selected. The Chair provides class information with digital photos and supply lists to the Brochure Editor and to the Web Mistress for the website.
- g. Facilities Chair The Facilities Chair is a liaison with the venue and the Quilt Wyoming Committee. The contract with the venue should be obtained and signed by the Committee Chair no less than two years before the event. On May 1 the Committee works to plan a menu with the venue and assures space is available for class assignments, lodging, vendors, quilt show, as well as the face-to-face WSQG Board meeting on the first day of Quilt Wyoming. The Chair must work with the venue to assure that technology is available for evening presentations, classrooms, and announcements that are made during the event. The Facilities Chair works closely with the Registrar and the Quilt Wyoming Treasurer.
- h. Opportunity Quilt The Opportunity Quilt Committee shall create and complete an Opportunity Quilt no less than one year before the event. If a published pattern is used, written permission must be obtained from the designer for the use of the pattern. The Opportunity Quilt will be unveiled at the Quilt Wyoming annual meeting the year prior to that committee's Quilt Wyoming. To comply with non-profit status requirements, the term "raffle quilt" should not be used when referring to the Opportunity Quilt or the sale of tickets. The opportunity quilt is a WSQG fundraiser and a means of putting WSQG before the public. WSQG will pay all reasonable expenses incurred in the making of the quilt and printing of the tickets, including costs for fabric, batting, quilting, and mailing the guilt and tickets. Bills for these items should be sent to the WSQG Treasurer. Sales tax must not be paid for any purchases on behalf of WSQG. The WSQG Treasurer will provide the documentation required for tax exempt purchases. A digital photo should be provided to the WSQG Web Mistress and the Patchwords Editor. Some of the proceeds from sale of tickets are used to purchase Books for County Libraries.
- i. Opportunity Quilt Mom The Opportunity Quilt Mom oversees ticket sales during the year before Quilt Wyoming. A minimum of 5,000 tickets should be printed. The Quilt Mom maintains a schedule for the Opportunity Quilt and assures that it is scheduled with shops and events throughout the state during the year. The Quilt Mom prepares and has a letter printed to provide each member with tickets. These letters with a photo of the quilt can be stuffed into envelopes at a Quilt Wyoming planning meeting. The letters are distributed after the annual meeting at the prior Quilt Wyoming. The Patchwords Editor can provide labels for all members to the Quilt Mom. After Quilt Wyoming the Patchwords Editor will take the remaining envelopes to mail with the WSQG non-profit bulk mail permit. The Quilt Mom assures that sufficient quantities of membership brochures and tickets accompany the quilt. Instructions accompany the quilt so that ticket stubs and funds from sale of tickets are sent to the WSQG Treasurer. The Quilt Mom provides the Web Mistress and Patchwords Editor a copy of the display schedule for publication. Money and ticket stubs collected from selling tickets will be submitted to the WSQG Treasurer who will keep an accounting. Adequate insurance should be purchased when mailing the quilt for display. Expense reimbursement should be requested by submitting the expense reimbursement form to the WSQG Treasurer. Within two weeks before the convention, money and tickets should not be mailed; instead, the money and ticket stubs should be hand delivered to the WSQG Treasurer at Quilt Wyoming. The Committee must arrange

for the drawing of the winning ticket during the annual meeting on the last day of the conference and delivery of the quilt to the winner if that person is not present at Quilt Wyoming.

- j. Challenge Contest One year before Quilt Wyoming the Challenge Contest Committee shall have authority to design the quilt challenge contest to reflect the theme of the event. The Committee may bestow ribbons and/or cash prizes at their discretion. Challenge packets may be sold after the annual meeting at the prior Quilt Wyoming after the theme is revealed, or rules may be made available without the sale of packets. The funds collected from the sale of packets must be submitted to the Quilt Wyoming Treasurer and will be used to offset the purchase of fabric and prizes. The Committee is in charge of providing ribbons, if awarded, and displaying the challenge quilts at Quilt Wyoming. Ballots are prepared and provided for members to vote for the people's choice awards. This may be in conjunction with the quilt show.
- k. Friendship Block The Friendship Block Committee is responsible for choosing or designing a simple block design to reflect the theme of the event. Clear and precise directions must be written and ready for inclusion in the brochure and on the website. The blocks should be collected at the registration table during check-in. The Committee is responsible for counting and dividing the blocks for the drawing at the end of the conference. A block can be drawn from each bag and that person is awarded that bag of blocks.
- I. Brochure Editor A color brochure is printed and sent to members no later than March 15 with return registration to be mailed beginning April 1 for WSQG members. Online registration will begin on April 15. The mailed registrations will be opened by the registrar on April 15 at the same time the online submissions are received. The Editor works closely with the Committee Chair, the Registrar, the National Instructor and Regional Instructor Chairs to receive class information, cancellation policy, and all other information needed for the brochure. The registration fee should be non-refundable. A digital copy of the brochure is provided to the Web Mistress for uploading to the website in advance of online registration which opens on April 15. The Editor coordinates with Patchwords Editor for printing and mailing. The Editor designs a poster with the Committee Chair, to be distributed to quilt shops and other places in the community, libraries, banks, etc. A flyer, to be included in the registration bags with classroom locations and other information is prepared and printed no less than two weeks before Quilt Wyoming.
- m. Publicity The Publicity Committee contacts newspapers, visitor centers, Chamber of Commerce, radio and TV stations to publicize the event. This should be done several times to provide updated information as planning progresses. The Publicity Committee encourages newspapers and TV to cover the actual event and quilt show and other events and is responsible for promoting the event with WSQG members and non-members and with local and statewide quilt guilds. The Publicity Committee promotes the vendor mall and quilt show to the public.
- n. Door Prizes The Door Prizes Committee should contact businesses locally and statewide, national manufacturers, designers and publishers that are appropriate for quilters. They should receive a list of contacts from the previous Quilt Wyoming Committee. They should update the list to be passed on shortly after Quilt Wyoming to the next Quilt Wyoming Committee with the other Quilt Wyoming records. The Committee must organize the door prize distribution during the event and prepare thank you postcards to the donors to be included with each door prize. The Quilt Wyoming committee has flexibility to handle door prizes in the manner they decide.
- o. Quilt Show The Quilt Show is optional. The committee has the flexibility to design the show in the manner the Quilt Wyoming Committee decides. The location must be secure. The Quilt Show registration forms must be available in the brochure and the website. The committee should secure quilt stands from the other WSQG regions, if needed. They must establish hours for open viewing, organize check-in and hanging of the entered quilts, schedule and provide people to act as security for the show. In addition, people's choice ballots are prepared and available at the show with pencils. Labels are prepared for the quilts before the show, using information from the entry forms. Gloves should be provided for viewers to use.

Ribbons may be designed or purchased. Cash prizes are not awarded. The Committee is responsible for show takedown and returning quilts to owners, and ensuring that quilt stands are bagged and returned to regional directors. The Quilt Show may include the challenge quilts.

- p. Name Tags The Committee designs and makes name tags or they may be purchased. They will be available to participants, committee members, instructors and vendors. The name tags should have space to accomodate meal tickets, room keys and any other tickets that may be distributed. Committee members, new WSQG members, instructors and vendors may have different colors to distinguish them.
- q. Logo Items The Committee is responsible for locating suppliers and obtaining prices at least six months in advance of the event. After May 30th, working with the Registrar for numbers, the registration bag (or other suitable container), tee shirts (or other clothing items) and pins should be ordered. It is suggested 10% extra should be ordered for later registrations. Any extra items can be sold or used as door prizes.
- r. Registration Bag (or other container) The Committee is responsible for gathering items for the bags in conjunction with the Registrar and the Logo Items Committee. Bags will include class information, dorm room assignments (if applicable), donated items, schedules, name tags, logo items and all necessary event information. Local information and flyers about the region may be included. The bags can be filled by the entire Quilt Wyoming Committee at a meeting of the Committee about a month before the event. Name tags are to be attached to the outside of the bags so they may be organized in alphabetical order for distribution at the registration table. The bags will need to be stored and delivered to Quilt Wyoming on the opening day. The WSQG Membership Director will provide pins for new members attending Quilt Wyoming to be included in the registration bags. The bag should contain a list of emergency contacts for the committee with the Committee Chair and the Facilities Committee Chair and other Committee members that may need to be contacted.
- s. Table Decorations/Favors Local and statewide guilds as well as the committee may make favors and decorations. If the event budget allows, some items may be purchased. Some items may be available from the Door Prize Committee. Volunteers should be available to place items on tables or hand out at the dining room door.
- t. Vendors About a year in advance the Vendor Committee should begin soliciting vendors with a letter stating space sizes and cost. Maps of space locations will be provided to vendors and spaces need to be marked before the vendor mall set up. Information about the loading dock should be provided as well as staggered times for unloading. Vendor evaluation forms should be provided to be passed on to the next committee. The Chair will be available on the day of arrival to aid vendors with set up and answer questions. The Chair must work with the Facilities Committee to obtain the needed tables for vendors. The Chair should check with vendors throughout the event to assist with problems and needs. Vendors should be provided with information to register for rooms and meals. If a vendor needs purchased meals delivered to their booth, this should be arranged. Vendors should be informed of water stations and restroom locations.
- u. Hospitality The Committee is responsible for providing small baskets with welcoming goodies for all instructors (ie, water, kleenex, crackers, gum, mints, chocolate, fruit, etc.), and placing them in the sleeping rooms or classrooms. The committee will organize water and snacks for participants to be made available in hallways between classrooms, if the committee decides to do so.
- v. Activities Coordinator (Optional) This Committee is responsible for coordinating "Show and Tell", dorm games (ie, Quilt-O, fat quarter poker, left-right-center, strip poker, etc.). Activity suggestions include brown bag UFO exchange, encouraging participants to finish the project and bring back for show and tell next year. If someone brings a bag, they must take one home. The Activities Coordinator may arrange other special activities, making sure activities are published ahead of time and information is printed

and ready to be included in confirmation letters so that participants can come prepared.

- w. Quilt Angels The registration form gives participants the opportunity to volunteer to be a Quilt Angel in classes where they are registered. A list of duties should be provided in the Quilt Angel's registration packet. The Quilt Angel takes attendance in classes, assists the instructor as needed, and distributes and collects evaluation forms. The Quilt Wyoming Committee assures that a list of Quilt Angel duties, the class student lists and evaluation forms are placed in each classroom for use by the Quilt Angel. The committee may provide a token gift (angel pin, for example) for the Quilt Angel. The committee should provide an emergency contact list in case additional items are needed, such as ironing boards or extension cords.
- x. Evaluation Sheets WSQG has designed evaluation sheets for classes and for the entire event. Any available unused evaluation sheets must be passed to the subsequent Quilt Wyoming Committee following the annual meeting. If forms need to be ordered, the board must be notified. WSQG will order forms and make them available to the Committee. Forms for the event should be included in the registration container. Announcements should be made to encourage participants to turn in their event evaluations. A box should be available at the registration table for event evaluation sheets. The forms must be passed on as soon as possible to the next Quilt Wyoming Chair for use by the committees.

DELETE: A. Quilt Wyoming - Site selection shall be made by the Quilt Wyoming committee a minimum of three (3) years in advance. Quilt Wyoming shall not be held in the same WSQG region consecutive years and every effort shall be made to hold it in every region over a period of ten (10) years. The recommended dates are the third weekend in July. Quilt Wyoming will rotate through the five regions in the following . order: Central, Southeast, Southwest, Northwest, Northeast. region shall decide the city in which the convention will be held.

- 1. Opportunity Quilt The Quilt Wyoming committee shall create and complete an Opportunity Quilt to be at the Quilt Wyoming annual meeting the year prior to that committee's Quilt Wyoming. To comply with non-profit status requirements, the term "raffle quilt" should not be used when referring to the Opportunity Quilt or the sale of tickets. If a published pattern is used, written permission must be obtained from the designer for the use of the pattern. The Opportunity Quilt committee will oversee ticket sales. The opportunity quilt is a WSQG fundraiser and a means of putting WSQG before the public. A committee in the region hosting Quilt Wyoming is responsible for making and selling tickets. WSQG will pay all reasonable expenses incurred in the making of the quilt and printing of the tickets, including costs of fabric, batting, quilting, and mailing the quilt and tickets. Bills for these items should be sent to the WSQG Treasurer. Moneys and ticket stubs collected from selling tickets will be submitted to the Treasurer who will keep an accounting. Adequate insurance should be purchased when mailing the quilt for display. Within two weeks before the convention money and tickets should not be mailed; the money and ticket stubs should be hand delivered to the WSQG Treasurer at Quilt Wyoming.
- 2. Challenge Contest A committee in the region that is hosting Quilt Wyoming shall have authority to design the quilt challenge contest. The committee may bestow ribbons and/or cash prizes at their discretion.

ADD: III. INTRODUCTION TO QUILTING CLASS AT QUILT WYOMING

A. PURPOSE

- 1. The purpose of this class during Quilt Wyoming is to spark interest in quilting and to bring learning and instruction to those interested by demonstrating and providing a hands-on introduction to quilting. This class is limited to first-time quilters only.
 - 2. It is optional for the Quilt Wyoming committee to offer this class.

- 1. The WSQG Treasurer will reimburse supply expenses up to \$1,000 for an actual class, when receipts are submitted. The WSQG Treasurer will compensate the committee for the teacher(s) consistent with payment to the other regional teachers at the event. If more than one person teaches the class, the daily instruction fee shall be divided equally between them.
- 2. Funds should not be obligated by the committee for this class until they are sure there is interest in the community and the class can proceed.
 - 3. If these rules are not adhered to, then funding will be withheld.

C. CLASSES

- 1. There must be a minimum of eight students for class to proceed.
- 2. There is no class fee, however the student must pay the registration fee. If a Quilt Wyoming charges different registration fees for members and nonmembers, the same rule applies to these students.
- 3. If students are under age 14, they need to have an adult accompany them in class. If the accompanying adult participates in other Quilt Wyoming classes they must be registered. If the Introduction to Quilting Class is the only class the accompanying adult is involved in, they will be contacted by the Registrar to find out if they are interested in purchasing meals during Quilt Wyoming.
- 4. Students must sign a Waiver of Liability Form. Students age 18 and under must have a parent or guardian sign the Waiver of Liability Form, which allows medical care, if needed, to be given to the minor student. Permission must be obtained to share photos of students and their work.

ADD: V. QUILT CAMPS

A. APPLICATION

- Quilt Camps are intended to introduce people to the art of quilting. The Quilt Camp Leadership Packet may be downloaded from the website and should be reviewed before making a funding request.
- 2. A Quilt Camp funding request must be completed by the member requesting funding and submitted to the Director at Large. The requestor will be contacted by the Director at Large and may be required to provide additional information. When the Director at Large deems that the request is in compliance with rules set forth by the Board, the application will be forwarded to the Board for review and subject to a vote to accept or decline the request.
- 3. Quilt Camps are not WSQG events. Advertising shall indicate that WSQG has sponsored the event.
- 4. Quilt Wyoming membership brochures shall be made available to students.

B. FUNDING

- 1. The maximum funding from WSQG per student shall not exceed \$50.00. The maximum for the total event shall not exceed \$500.
- Funds will be available on a first come, first served basis after January 1st annually, as long as funds are available for that year.
- 3. A list of students attending the camp will be presented to the WSQG Treasurer within 30 days after the camp. Photos and a synopsis of the event should be sent to the Director at Large to be shared with the Board, Patchwords and Website. When possible, these photos and the quilts should be made available for display at an upcoming Quilt Wyoming.
- 4. If documentation is not presented to show the number in attendance, funding will not be authorized. If attendance is less than stated in the initial request, only funds for the number of participants

will be issued.

5. If the rules herein are not adhered to, WSQG reserves the right to cancel the obligation and allocate funds to another event should an application be presented and approved by the Board.

VI. QUILT SHOW SPONSORSHIP

A. APPLICATIION

- 1. Quilt show organizers may apply for a grant to pay for expenses. Application may be made on the website or by completing the mail-in the form. WSQG membership is not required for an organizer. The quilt show will not be considered a WSQG event.
- 2. The requestor will be contacted by the WSQG Treasurer and may be required to provide additional information. When the Treasurer deems that the request is in compliance with rules set forth by the Board, the application will be forwarded to the Board for review and subject to a vote to accept or decline the request.

B. FUNDING

1. The maximum funding from WSQG per quilt show shall not exceed \$200.00. A total of \$1,000 is budgeted per year. Funding is

allocated statewide, not by region and is available on a first come, first served basis after January 1, annually.

- 2. The WSQG Treasurer will issue payment to the organizer upon request.
- The Quilt Show should list WSQG as a sponsor on their advertising.
