President's Corner



Fall is definitely in the air. Not only are days shorter and temperatures lower, but my urge to sew is stronger. Fall is a transition season, not just between summer and winter but between indoor and outdoor activities, for most of us. As a quilter and gardener I am always somewhat conflicted during spring and summer when there is so much that needs to be done in my yard. Because summer activities are seasonal it is often my sewing that takes a backseat to outdoor activities. Now once my yard is put to bed for the year I can focus on the things I love to do in the colder months — sewing, cooking, jigsaw puzzles etc.

Making time to sew is always a challenge, even in the winter months. There are many tasks that we all feel responsible for. It is easy for sewing to fall to the bottom of our to-do lists. A couple of years ago I was invited to join seven quilters who have a quilt retreat twice a year in a home in Spanish Fork, Utah. With six bedrooms, four baths, a fully stocked kitchen and a large room containing ironing stations, cutting tables, and individual sewing tables for each quilter, it is my idea of quilting heaven. Three and a half days devoted only to sewing is such a treat and is something that is virtually impossible to accomplish at home. After four nights away, we return home rested and replenished, with a lot of progress on old and new quilt projects.

Quilt retreats take many forms; some are overnight events while others are shorter. Some involve learning a new technique while others are a way for quilters to work on their individual projects. Regardless of the format, each retreat is an opportunity to get away from the responsibilities of daily life and focus solely on something we love.

Each retreat is an opportunity to reconnect with old friends and make new friends. I hope there is a quilt retreat in the future of each of you.

Many quilt retreats are made possible by financial assistance from the Wyoming State Quilt Guild. It is one of the many ways the WSQG fulfills its mission to "unite those who love the quilter's art, to preserve the heritage of quilts and be a source of education." As the Board again seeks a revision of the standing rules for regional events which protects the non-profit status of the Wyoming State Quilt Guild while recognizing and accommodating the individual needs of each region, I hope you will share your thoughts and concerns about this issue. Your input is important. The WSQG is your organization.



Can you describe how you became a quilter? In the late 1980's I made a Christmas tree skirt with squares and ties: at the time I didn't realize I was quilting. Then in 1993 when we were stationed in Germany, I took a beginner quilting class. Everything was sewn by hand. I couldn't even cheat because my sewing machine was in storage back in the United States. It is my oldest UFO (still needs to be quilted). My

real start was following my move to Wyoming in 2012. I was invited by Joan Peters to join Prayers & Squares. I started out simply pinning the backs to quilts and tying the quilts. Soon that wasn't enough and I just had to learn how to make the guilt tops. The rest is history.

What techniques do you enjoy and what do you

like most about quilting? I enjoy most techniques, particularly learning something new, however binding is my least favorite part of the process. Designing is my favorite part. Whether it is picking out the colors and fabrics, modifying a pattern to make it larger or smaller or designing my own pattern. I like designing my own quilts. I'm easily bored making repetitive blocks. I lean towards what are considered art quilts. I have an artistic background as a wood carver/ sculptor, and love to add 3D elements to my quilts. I'm a bit of a bird lover so birds are a common theme in my guilts.

Describe your first quilt and what inspired you to choose that design?

My first quilt was the beginner's class I took in 1993. Since it was a class, I didn't get to pick the design.

However, with no knowledge or anyone to even ask for advice, I took my list to the BX (store on Bitburg Airbase) and went shopping for five fabrics. We all made the four same blocks but none looked the same

because of fabric choices and how we arranged them. I had the most fun rearranging (and rearranging some more) the colors within the blocks. I didn't think I would ever get the drunkard's path block together because every time I moved one the whole design of the block changed.







On the Inside in the 2024 Governor's Capitol Art Exhibition and Greeting the Dawn in the 2022 show. Greeting the Dawn was also published in the book, Stitched Journeys with Birds: Inspiration to Let Your Creativity Take Flight, in 2023.

Who has inspired you?

Everyone! I'm always amazed at retreats, seeing what everyone has made. I always leave inspired by what I saw. I am a member of Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA). The members are all so talented and I'm inspired by all of them, but Kestrel Michaud is one of my favorite quilt artists. Janet Stone, love her whimsical "ewe" designs and that every block is different. I also like Laura Wasilowski for all her embroidery work.

Describe some of your favorite quilting tools?

My seam ripper, haha! Not necessarily my favorite but probably the most used. Those who know me, know I'm a bit of a perfectionist, so I rip and fix even though I know on my galloping horse I'll never see it. But I'll know its there and it will drive me crazy. I bought a pencil holder that sticks to my machine and holds my seam ripper perfectly so it never gets lost in my pile of scraps.

Scraps are a favorite too. Since I make a lot of my own designs/quilts I often have to figure out how it's going to go together first. I like to practice and make sure things are going to work the way I think before committing to the "good" fabric.

List your favorite quilting books, including pattern

books or quilting novels and why you favor them? When one of my guilds has a challenge, I like to challenge myself by using a technique I haven't done before in the challenge. Therefore, I tend to purchase technique versus pattern books. I learn something new and am inspired to try new techniques. Intentional Thread: A Guide to Drawing Gesture and Color in Stitch, The Royal School of Needlework Book of Embroidery, Fabric Surface Design are a few of my favorites. I also like Angela Walters' Shape By Shape

What advice do you have for beginning quilters? Play and don't be afraid of mistakes. Learn techniques. When you take a class, don't take one

books and Christina Cameli's Step-by-Step Texture

Quilting for quilting designs.

techniques. When you take a class, don't take one with the goal of having a finished project at the end.

Take classes for the techniques taught. Then use and

adapt them to your own work.

Where do you hope your quilting journey leads next?

I hope to become a more confident quilter and get my stack of quilts quilted. I like doing the whole process myself but I am timid when it comes to the quilting. After spending all that time piecing I get quilting paralysis for fear of messing it up. My hesitancy comes from the vision I have in my head of what I want to quilt versus what I am capable of quilting. I know practice is the key, but setting a side time to practice is difficult when there are so many new quilts flying around in my head waiting to be set free.



to Quiltster a subscription-based fabric
auditioning website.

The Sept. 2 meeting will host guest speaker Diana Fox. Her topic is on "The Art of Quilting." There is a \$5 guest fee. The Oct. 6 meeting will host Diane Harris, The Stash Bandit, as the guest speaker. Her topic will be "Extraordinary Scrap Quilts." There is a \$5 guest fee. On Oct. 7 Diane Harris will be giving a presentation, "Intro to Improv Scrap Quilts." This class filled quickly. On Nov. 3 Marcia (Martie) Nowell, will be giving a program on "Studio 180 Rulers." There is a \$5 guest fee.

Registration for the southeast regional retreat, Oct. 3-5, was opened on Aug. 1. It was filled by Aug. 11. The retreat is being held at Laramie County Community College (LCCC) in Cheyenne. There is a wait list.
