Scott Flanagan, Featured Instructor, Quilt Wyoming 2026 - Powell, WY

Scott Flanagan grew up in Colorado. He moved to Fremont, NE, 20 years ago to attend college. While in college he took a job at Country Traditions so he could make some graduation quilts and save money. It was during his 17 years there, that Scott kick started his design company, 4th & Main Designs, which has expanded from patterns to books, fabric and more.

Scott learned to sew at the tender age of seven from his maternal grandmother – how to sew a straight seam and how to press that seam. Her love of quilting was an inspiration for him and his quilting.

When he was hired full time at the quilt store in Fremont. He was encouraged to go deeper into the quilting industry. In 2011 Scott decided he might as well make some money from his sewing. He designed his first two patterns which sold at the store. This led to his submitting patterns to magazines, to which he got lots of turndowns. Finally, Scott got a call from Quiltmaker magazine - they wanted to include him in a special issue featuring male quilters. That branched out to his patterns being accepted in partner magazines, Fons and Porter and McCalls. 2020 found Scott contracting with Northcott and Banyan Batiks to do a block of the month for his Illusions quilt.

The same day he was discussing the block of the month, Banyan Batiks called him and asked him to design a fabric line. The same day, his editor from *Quiltmaker*, who had changed jobs to work with *Quilter's World*, a new magazine, asked Scott for a submission for the first issue. She thought

he should create a book too! All in one day – block of the month contract, asked to design a fabric line, a request for submission for a quilt magazine's first issue, and the suggestion he should write a book!

Things have only expanded from there. On December 31, 2023, he resigned his position with Nebraska Quilt Company. He now travels the US doing speaking engagements and classes for shops, guilds, and whoever wants to hire him. He also vends at quilt shows around the country. In 2024, he traveled 37,000 miles to over 35 states. Every summer, from May through Labor Day, he leads a free quilt-along on his Facebook page and through his website, www.4thandmaindesigns.com.

On a more personal side, in 2017 Scott was diagnosed with a voice disorder, spasmodic dysphonia. This has affected his speaking, leaving him without a clear speaking voice. He has used his quilting as a means of healing and communicating. Scott has found a family in the community of quilters. This family has helped him through the darkest days of his disorder. He has held fundraisers to raise awareness and support, as he has struggled with this condition.

Scott has two things he likes to tell people at the beginning of his lectures and classes. First, a project is only hard if someone tells you it's hard before you begin. Second, you learn some of the best lessons from mistakes you make along the way. He says he has always lived by these two rules, and they have never failed him yet. We are pleased Scott will be joining us for Quilt Wyoming 2026 in Powell at Northwest College on July 8-12, 2026. We look forward to his classes and lecture and what he will be sharing with us.

President's Corner

As I drove home yesterday from the Board of Directors meeting in Casper I thought about how the WSQG has grown since 2018 when I first went on the Board as the Southwest Regional Director. If I remember correctly, at that time there

were only around 400 members in the WSQG. At yesterday's meeting we found out that we now have 743 members! What a huge increase (almost double) in less than ten years.

Even more remarkable to me was the increase in membership in my region. The Southwest Region historically had the fewest members compared to each of the other four regions, and we often had fewer members than the out-of-state category. Now we are 109 members strong.

I believe the membership growth overall is due to several factors such as an increase in the quantity and quality of regional retreats, the perseverance of local shops in providing quilters with such a variety of creative options, the hard work and dedication of our Board members, the connections we foster in our local guilds and the enthusiasm and creativity of our members. We each have a

responsibility to help sustain the growth of quilting in Wyoming by shopping at our local quilt stores, joining our local quilt guilds, signing up for regional retreats and Quilt Wyoming and — most of all, continuing to share our enthusiasm and energy with each other. It's contagious!

And here's something I think is really interesting. Wyoming has a population of around 500,000 people and the WSQG has 743 members. Utah has a population of about 3.5 million people, yet its state guild has only about 500 members. That really says a lot about the quilt culture in our state.

Even though July seems far away, it will be here before we know it. At the annual membership meeting in Powell, the positions of president elect, membership director, director at large, and directors for the central and southwest regions will be on the ballot. I hope everyone will consider volunteering for those positions because the WSQG is only as strong as its members. Please contact Julie Haptonstall, our President-Elect, if you are interested in serving.

The holidays are just around the corner. I hope all of your holidays are peaceful and happy, and shared with family and friends. Thanksgiving is especially meaningful and I hope you, like me, are thankful for the Wyoming State Quilt Guild.







Featured Quilter Jean Gorman

Once upon a time in the beautiful Black Hills of South Dakota, my journey with needle and thread began in my parent's home. I started with latch hook rugs, needlepoint, counted cross stitch and a tiny splash of embroidery. Both my father and mother were very supportive and funded my endeavors much to my delight. At age ten, my mother, MaryAnn, a fabulous seamstress, enrolled me in 4-H and so began the push and pull between two first born women as she taught me how to sew many a garment, when I'd rather be doing something else. I'm sure some of you may have experienced this with your mother and/or offspring. I'm glad she was persistent as I was awarded a trip to Chicago as the 1985 South Dakota 4-H Congress delegate in Fashion Revue.

As the next chapter unfolded, I graduated from South Dakota State University with a degree in Home Economics Education. I started teaching at Campbell County High School in Gillette. I soon met a handsome Wyoming native, Brent, who is now my husband of 34 years. Well, like I wasn't busy enough planning a wedding, I decided to use a convenience leave day and take my very first quilt class from Cynthia Saunders, owner of And Sew On in Gillette. It was a green and peach Lover's Knot pattern. I learned the basics of cutting and piecing. Always a networker, I called Patti Knotts and asked if I could stop by and get advice on the border as I was angling the corners. Ever the patient and kind teacher, she instructed me in the best way to complete the border and binding. Cynthia had told me everyone should hand quilt at least one quilt. I started and then sent it to the long-arm quilter.

The next chapter of life included welcoming three beautiful daughters to our family and Brent building two log homes for us. Quilting took a back seat during this time. Once

again I signed up for a class at The Quilt Nook in Gillette with Bonnie Vidick. The pattern was called Puzzle Quilt.

County and state fairs have always been a source of inspiration for me and a time to connect with friends and family. In 2002 I became the Campbell County Superintendent of Needle and Fancy Work. a position I still hold. I'm in awe of the beautiful pieces of fiber art that we display every summer. After being in this position for several years I learned that Patti Knotts was a former superintendent of this department. I was humbled to be selected at the NEW Quilt Show for the Patti Knotts Award. She was a beautiful person and piecer.

In the Fall of 2012 I joined the Quilt Chicks after meeting a few "chicks" at the NEW Quilt Show. They are an awesome bunch of ladies that are so talented! Their kindness and willingness to help, willing to help with any quilting question to sharing a new recipe, warms my heart. In 2016, a Quilt Chick, shared a website called Quiltville and so began my new path as a follower of Bonnie K. Hunter and her scrappy mystery quilts. Lori Holt, Bee in my Bonnet, and Edyta Sitar, Laundry Basket Quilts, are two other quilters I favor. When I quilt I listen to audiobooks and have completed the Elm Creek Quilts series by Jennifer Chiaverini. Techniques I enjoy are machine appliqué and paper piecing, however I must switch up occasionally to break up the monotony.

I joined Heartfelt Quilt of Valor in 2025 and presented two veterans with quilts, so far, my father, Gregory, and friend, Terry Anderson.

In 2014, I joined the Wyoming State Quilt Guild and have attended three Quilt Wyoming's - two in Cheyenne and one

in Sheridan. One of my favorite quilts was shown in Sheridan in 2022, it's called Rainbow Geese on a String, where I paper pieced the geese. It is satisfying to use scraps of fabric that might otherwise go unused, thus turning it into a beautiful and useful quilt. My favorite thing about WSQG is the willingness of members to share tips and tricks with a compassionate heart. Thank you!

My favorite quilting tools are my trusty Bernina 1090, going strong since 1991, my Clover seam ripper, and a nice, hot, dry iron with some Best Press. Advice for beginner



Paintbrush Piecers Quilt Guild in


