Karla Alexander Featured Instructor - Quilt Wyoming 2026 - Powell, WY



Karla Alexander is the fifth of five children. She spent her formative years in Idaho, Washington, California and back to Idaho. She learned her basic quilting skills from her mother, who did what Karla called "utilitarian quilting." The quilts were often "event" quilts (birthdays, anniversaries, new babies). The fabric was picked to match the person. When Karla helped, such as gathering material or supplies, she would be able to use the sewing machine.

Her first quilt was for her first baby. The quilting bug didn't erupt for her until she and her husband moved to Kodiak Island, AK, for two years. What else do you do during the dark winter months?

Upon her return to Oregon, she started teaching classes, often with

hand-written notes. Teaching led to pattern writing. Soon after, she had her first pattern published. While at Quilt Market in Houston, she met Carol Doak while on a bus. During their conversation, Carol suggested that Karla write a book. That first book was the first of eight books published by Martindale Press.

Karla has since shifted to publishing her designs as individual patterns under the Saginaw Street Quilt Company. Her quilt designs have evolved from straight lines to curves to hand-cut circles that are set into fabric. Even Ricky Tims of The Quilt Show, was surprised with her circle technique.


For the past 23 years Karla has also been involved with the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show in Sisters, OR. She will be missing that this year, as she will be with us at Quilt Wyoming in Powell, both falling at the same time. We're glad she is choosing to be with us.

Karla's favorite part of quilting is having several projects going at the same time. She is also particular about her fabric choices and usually only buys in half yard pieces, unless it is for borders or backings.

Karla's words of wisdom for us – Don't let your mistakes

disappoint you. Use them as stepping stones to your final destination. We each have our own starting point. We gather information, enjoying the process and learning from the process, realizing mistakes are all part of the process.

We are looking forward to having Karla as one of our featured instructors at Quilt Wyoming 2026, with all she will have to share with us.






QUILT CAMPS



These funds must be requested by a WSQG member. A Leadership Packet with the guidelines and the application to request funds can be found at www.WSQG.org under Quilt Camp.



Quilt show organizers may apply for a grant to pay for expenses. Application may be made on the website or by completing the mail-in the form. WSQG membership is not required for an organizer.

The quilt show will not be considered a WSQG event. Acknowledgment of WSQG sponsorship in advertising the show is appreciated.

The requestor will be contacted by the WSQG Treasurer and may be required to provide additional information. When the Treasurer deems that the request is in compliance with rules set forth, the application will be forwarded to the Board for review and subject to a vote to accept or decline the request.

The maximum funding from WSQG per quilt show shall not exceed \$200.00. A total of \$1,000 is budgeted per year. Funding is allocated statewide, not by region and is available on a first-come, first-served basis after January 1, annually.

For the January program CHQ members Cleata Zlenka and Debbie Przymus will be presenting a trunk show of their beautiful quilts. They both use the Accuquilt die cut system. They adapt quilt patterns specifically to use the Accuquilt. Per Cleata, "It is a

very rare quilt that has not been cut out using this method."

Cindi Young has announced the CHQ "Beat the Winter Blues" quilt retreat March 6-7, to be held at Laramie County Community College. Cost is \$90 and includes a six-foot table and all meals. This year a drawing will be held and one lucky quilter will get the next year's retreat registration paid for. 




