Welcome to Quilt Wyoming 2026!

Welcome to Quilt Wyoming 2026, held on the campus of Northwest College (NWC), 231 West 6th Street, Powell, Wyoming. Quilt Wyoming is the annual celebration of quilting for our members and friends.

Quilt Wyoming Registration: Quilt Wyoming 2026 (QW26) registrations will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis after April 15, 2026. Registration online (www.wsqg.org) will be open at 12:00 a.m. on April 15, 2026. Mailed registrations should not be postmarked prior to April 15, 2026. Envelopes postmarked before that date will be opened after May 1, 2026. Class fees are listed in two amounts: WSQG members and non-members. If you wish to join WSQG, complete the online membership application to be paid with PayPal or Credit Card or you may mail your \$20 check with the membership application, which is printed in this brochure on page four to:

Important Dates:

- **Now** – WSQG membership applications can be completed online or mailed.
- **April 15** – QW26 members may register online or mail
- **May 1** – QW26 non-members may register online or mail
- **June 8** - All shirt orders are due.
- **June 15** – Last date written cancellations will be accepted for partial refunds
- **July 8-12** – Attend Quilt Wyoming 2026.

Check in at NWC: Registration will be held in the NWC Student Center, which will be well marked. The registration desk will be staffed 2:00 - 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday and 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Thursday and Friday and 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. on Saturday. Parking is available behind the Student Center as well as to the west of the Yellowstone Building.

Housing: Participants have the option of staying in Simpson Hall at the NWC at a cost of \$132.00 per person for the entire four-night stay (\$33.00 per night). Suites have a common area, four separate bedrooms and a bathroom with separate toilet and shower. (There are a limited number of rooms which will be allocated as registrations are processed.

Ashley Hall (which we will not use unless we run out of rooms in Simpson Hall) are double bedrooms with shared

bath facilities.

Linens are not provided. The beds are extra-long twin beds. Participants will need to bring their own towels. See elsewhere in this brochure for information about local motels and parking for RV's. If you choose to stay off campus, we recommend that you reserve your room soon.

Meals: All meals are served cafeteria style in the Student Center, and include vegetarian and gluten-free options. Special dietary requests and allergy alerts must be attached to the Registration Form. Cost of the 11-meal plan (dinner Wednesday, breakfasts, lunches, dinners on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, and brunch on Sunday) will be \$120. The three-meal plan for Thursday, Friday or Saturday is \$32.50/day. The Wednesday dinner is \$12.50 and the Sunday brunch is \$10. Individual meals may be purchased at the door.

Alcohol and Smoking Policy: NO alcohol is to be served or permitted on campus at any time. Please respect the policy of the college in this regard. All buildings on campus are smoke-free. In addition, please respect the comfort of other participants who may be allergic to perfume.

Class Locations: All classes will be held on the NWC campus. Details about specific classes will be provided at check-in. For your comfort, please note that all of the classroom buildings have elevators, but are not necessarily close to parking lots, so bring your "wheels" to make moving your sewing machines and essentials easier. All classrooms are air conditioned.

Accessibility Considerations: Please note that we will be on a college campus with plentiful parking close to all facilities. If you feel that you will need a wheelchair to make your QW26 a more positive experience, please contact Ginny ([gsingerph@gmail](mailto:gsingerph@gmail.com)) prior to your arrival.

Vendor Mall: There is not an appropriate space for a vendor mall. Cut 'n Sew is located in Powell and Friends and Co. is located in Cody (20 miles away). Instructors will have patterns and supplies as listed in class listings.

Challenge Quilts: This QW will be hosting the QW26 "WYld & WYacky challenge. All challenge quilts will be received at the registration table upon your arrival. Please note there is no pre-registration required for your challenge quilts. There will be voting and prizes for each of the challenges. Awards and/or ribbons will be presented at the Saturday evening program.

Welcome to Quilt Wyoming 2026!

Evening Programs: There will be action-packed programs on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings that are included in your registration fee. NO EXTRA COST! Each of the National Instructors will present a stunning and entertaining trunk show/lecture. The evening programs will also include announcements, the Parade of Class Projects, the Walking Quilt Show and special door prizes. Challenges and friendship block winners will be announced at the Saturday evening program

Quilt Show: We will have the NW region's traditional "Walking Quilt Show" during the evening programs. The schedule for the Walking Quilt Show will be alphabetically based on your last name:

- A-G will show on Thursday evening
- H-O will show on Friday evening
- P-Z will show on Saturday evening

Opportunity Quilt: The 2026 Opportunity Quilts "Wyld & WYacky" will be on display at the registration desk in the NWC Student Center. Tickets will be available for sale until 4:00 p.m. on Saturday. The winning tickets will be drawn on Sunday morning at the conclusion of the WSQG business meeting. Ticket money and stubs can be handed in at the registration table.

QW Swag: Be sure to order your long-sleeved denim shirt with your registration, as they will not be available for purchase at QW26. Orders for shirts must be received by June 8 to be processed. Pins are included in your registration fee. Shirts may be ordered to be mailed for an additional postage fee.

Friendship Blocks: Follow the instructions on the 2026 Friendship Block pattern, found in this brochure (on page 16), and on the website (www.wsqg.org). Bring your finished, signed block(s) to the registration desk before 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 11, 2026. Your name will go into a drawing once for each block that you turn in. Drawings for the blocks will be at the Saturday evening program.

Open Sew: If you are not interested in taking classes but still want to experience the excitement of QW26, consider signing up for Open Sew -- a day-long retreat where you can work on your own projects.

Welcome to Quilt Wyoming 2026!

Quilt Appraisals: Deb Kipp, WSQG member and quilt appraiser, will have a room for quilt appraisals during QW26 on Thursday, July 9th. She can appraise ten quilts a day. You will have to make a reservation with her for your quilt. Contact her prior to QW26 to make your arrangements. Written appraisals are \$50 and verbal appraisals are \$25 (payable by check or cash). Contact Deb at 307-689-2746.

Class Selection: You will notice as you look at the brochure that there is a wide selection of classes! We included classes that will appeal to all levels and interests of today's quilters. To help make class selection easier, please check out the online brochure at www.wsqg.org for larger class project photos and complete supply lists. Teachers' emails are listed if you have specific questions for them.

Confident Beginner is a term that often confuses new (and experienced) quilters. It refers to those quilters who are comfortable with a consistent 1/4-inch seam allowance and who understand safe and accurate use of a rotary cutter. We welcome all quilters to expand their skills and enhance their repertoire by taking classes that will push them a bit, both artistically and technically.

Class Preparation: If you are taking a class that requires a sewing machine, it is expected that you will show up to the class with your machine ready to sew. A clean and dust-free sewing machine with a new needle is always a great way to begin the class. If you will be doing rotary cutting, put in a new or newish blade. If you are taking a handwork class, bring a task lamp and/or glasses if needed. The instructors expect that you will be ready to learn, as they put in many hours of preparation to get themselves ready to teach!

Coffee and Water Stations: There will be coffee and water stations set up in the classroom buildings.

Her quilt, *Piece and Quiet*, was distinguished as one of the Hundred Best Quilts of the 20th Century. Her quilt, *Power of Houston*, is on permanent display in the Visitor Center at the George Brown Convention Center in Houston.

Cynthia teaches and lectures nationally and internationally. To date, she has shared her techniques at quilting events in South Africa, Taiwan, Japan, South Korea, Germany, Canada, Australia, Spain, Mexico, and Kuwait.

In addition, she is the designer and owner of England Design Studios, which is a publishing/pattern company that specializes in the "Picture Piecing technique." She has designed over 80 patterns that use her technique. She has written two books explaining the process. 1. Rewind - Karla Alexander

Skill Level: Intermediate to Advanced

Based on a mix of contrasting squares, these blocks each unwind in a slightly different pattern. Explore the freedom of working your quilt one block at a time. Come ready to relax, cut free-form or use the provided template to cut your squares and SEW! No fussy points to match up, just pure straight line cutting and piecing and... of course, playing with your fabric choices. We'll discuss the decision to change the size of the blocks as well as work the pieced border making your quilt just as YOU like. You'll also learn a lot of extra cutting and piecing techniques to add to your quilting toolbox of tricks. Finished quilt size - 52" x 68"

2. Large Landscape - Waterfall - Cynthia England

Skill Level: Intermediate



Ever wanted to create a realistic picture out of fabric? Then this is the class for you! Let this award winning instructor guide you through this forgiving technique with making this stunning waterfall. Not foundation pieced! No paper to pick out. Simple straight line sewing with right sides together; very forgiving! Finished size 26" X 36".

3. Changes in Seasons II - Scott Flanagan

Skill Level: Confident Beginner

Learn how to master flying geese units and create the unique geese in the bands.

4. Summer Wild Flowers Wall Hanging - Connie Dilts 2 DAYS

Skill Level: All

Participants in the class will use wool applique pieces on cotton fabric. First we will prepare the cotton background and wool for the applique process. Then we will use hand embroidery stitches and beads to embellish the pattern. A variety of sewing and embroidery techniques, using a variety of threads, needles, and beads, will be used to produce a fun wall hanging.

Optional Material kit fee: \$25.00 or bring your own supplies.

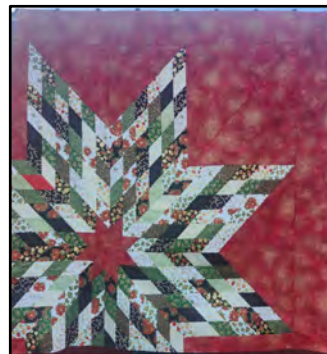
Summer Wild Flowers Pattern: \$9.00

8. WYld & WYacky Free Motion on Your Domestic Sewing Machine - Ruth Davis Skill Level: Confident Beginner



Come spend the day learning to quilt your projects using Free Motion Quilting on your domestic machine! The first part of the class will focus on repetition and learning the basics. Part two will allow students to "play on their domestic machines! Remember, these are just for practice! Plan on having fun, staying relaxed, and laughing! We are going to "train our brains!" Fortunately the quilt police won't see these!

9. Charmed to Meet You - Tammy Day Skill Level: Beginner

This beginner-friendly quilt is really quick and easy! This quilt is precut and scrap friendly. A stunning quilt that can be assembled quickly. 59 1/2" x 67"

10. Old Rag Horse - Kaye Evans Skill Level: All



My Original quilt was made in 1994. I have since made it as a dog, bunny, kitty and other animals to delight the child in all of us. The original quilt uses scraps of plaid fabric, but florals and prints look just as charming. You could even mix it all up and make it a barnyard quilt. How about adding a fence? The process is the same, you are the artist. The eyes are buttons and the tail and mane are embroidery floss. Let your imagination soar. Depending on your determination and drive, you could get a couple of animals completed in class and

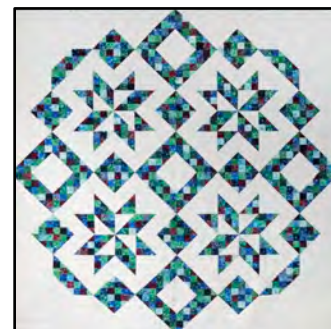
some of your 5" sashing strips. The size of finished quilt is 44" x 52" Look at old coloring books and old patterns to locate other animals if you don't want to do horses. I will bring animal pictures with me also.

11. Cloud Nine - Patricia Heintz Skill Level: All

Cloud Nine uses Studio 180 Design Tucker Trimmer I tool to make Shaded 4-Patch units to create this beautiful quilt. The pattern is fat quarter friendly.

12. Simply Wave Tote - Gina Kleppinger Skill Level: All

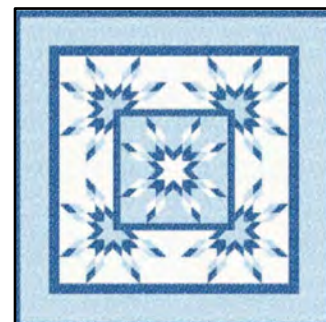


Creating simple waves with fabric manipulation gives great dimension to the tote, 21" x 26". It also has a well-stabilized pocket inside as well as a zipper pocket. Since the pattern only requires half strips (width of fabric) – You can do this project with a friend or make two. Some pre-class work is required to make the most of class time. **Pattern: \$15.00 available from instructor**

13. Four Corner Starburst - Robbie Lliteras-Heib Skill Level: Intermediate

This is an exclusive pattern of the Strawberry Patch Quilt Shop. Any three colors will work as long as light, medium and dark fabrics are selected. The center of the quilt measures 64" x 64." Other sizes are achieved by adding borders around the center. The Illustrated quilt was designed to fit a king size bed and measures 90" x 90".

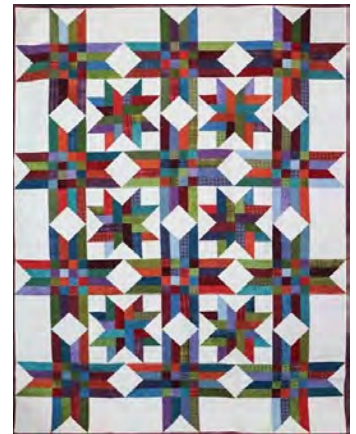


19. Scott Flanagan - Falling Stars

Skill Level: Confident Beginner

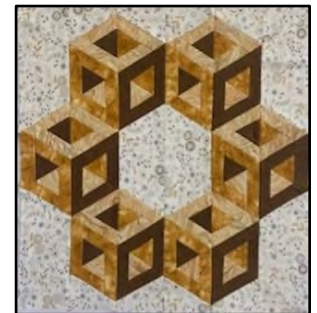

The class begins with a presentation from a recipient of a Quilts of Valor.® The purpose of this is to let the students know the seriousness of the service that is being honored and how the end result will be presented. WSQG assists the program by providing funds through our Quilt Camp Program.

Educational Focus:

- Respect, listening, history, communication
- Eye-hand coordination, concentration, stepping out of their comfort zone
 - Teamwork, decision making
 - Math, ruler work, color values
 - Ironing and rotary cutter safety
 - Organization, patience, accuracy
- Personal growth, self confidence, fostering relationships

Lessons Learned: Public speaking, presentation planning, appropriate dress, language arts, self confidence and growth

Impact on Students: Observations of the students are that they truly enjoying the aspects of teamwork. They are proud of the decisions they have the opportunity to make and they feel that they are part of a larger community. We occasionally have guests, quilt teachers, shop owners, and Quilt of Valor® representatives. It is very interesting to hear them speak about why they chose this class. Quilt Wyoming 2026

Stack and WYacky Friendship Blocks

Rules:

1. Nothing needs to line up. No matching of seams.
2. Use a 1/4" seam.
3. Press seams open.

Cutting fabric:

1. Start with five different 10" squares
2. Stack fabrics on top of each other (right sides up). Cuts will be through all 5 blocks at one time.
3. Make first cut from bottom to top at a somewhat vertical angle. Remember, it is to be wonky, not straight up and down.
4. There are now 2 halves with one-half larger than the other. Take the larger section and make 2 cuts at different horizontal angles. Remember, it is to be wonky. Mark these sections 1-3.
5. On the other section, make 1 cut at a somewhat horizontal angle near the middle. Mark these sections 4-5
6. There will be 5 sections after all cuts are made.

Re-stacking fabric:

1. Do not rearrange section 1.
2. On section 2, take top piece and place it on the bottom of section 2.
3. On section 3, take top 2 pieces and place them on the bottom of section 3.
4. On section 4, take top 3 pieces and place them on the bottom of section 4.
5. On section 5, take top 4 pieces and place them on the bottom of section 5.

Separate layers:

1. Separate each layer into 5 blocks. There will be 1 piece of each fabric in a different spot on each block,

Sew together by block:

1. Sew section 1 to section 2, and then section 2 to section 3.
2. Sew section 4 to section 5. There will now be 2 sections (halves).
3. Trim the edge of each half where they are to be sewn together.
4. Line up as close as possible. They won't be perfect.
5. Sew the first section to the second section.

Square up to 8-1/2".
